These officer candidates are currently managers and officers who have each agreed to serve a second term (of two years) as officers of ABHS.

William L. Frederickson, Jr. is the retired minister of First Baptist Church in Freehold, NJ. His service at First Baptist Church began in 1987 and continued for 27 years. Frederickson also served as a chaplain and instructor in religion at Wayland Academy in Beaver Dam, WI and as a minister of education at First Baptist Church in Westfield, NJ. He has an MDiv from Colgate-Rochester Divinity School, where he studied under Winthrop Hudson. His past and present ABC service includes the Board of General Ministries ABC-USA; Professional Ministry Committee ABCNJ; ABCNJ Council; Board of International Ministries and MMBB.

Everett C. Goodwin of Fairfax, VA, has authored many publications on Baptist history, including most recently *MMBB: A Pioneer in Employee Benefits*. He is also author of the classic text, *Down By the Riverside: A Brief History of Baptist Faith* and editor of *Baptists in the Balance: The Tension between Freedom and Responsibility*. An ordained ABC minister, Goodwin has been senior pastor of five churches, including First Baptist Church, Washington, DC.

John Douhan retired in 1997 after serving as associate executive minister for The American Baptist Churches of Massachusetts (TABCOM). He also served as executive minister for the Inter-Church Council of Greater New Bedford (MA). He has been president of the Massachusetts American Baptist Historical Society and an ecumenical officer of TABCOM.

Heidi Holmstrom is a motion picture specialist for the National Archives and Records Administration in Washington, DC. While studying for her master's degree in history and archives at Western Washington University, she interned at the National Archives, where she learned techniques of film preservation. She assisted the AB Historical Society in applying for two grants in support of film preservation, including grants that restored the film, *Good News*,

the story of the Mather School for African American girls in South Carolina, and also the film, *Crow Indians on the Jesus Trail*.

Jonathan Malone is the senior pastor at First Baptist Church, East Greenwich, RI. He has also completed a Phd at the University of Dayton, with his dissertation on Baptist ordination. He has published articles on Baptist history and been active in the ABC Ministers Council. He currently serves on the BGM for ABC-USA.
