Next Steps in Transformed by the Spirit November 2014

Accomplishments in transitioning from Phase One to Phase Two

- The ACT/ALT workbooks have been combined into one ACT (Adaptive Challenge Team) guidebook and the material relating to experiments has been improved and updated
- The roles of facilitator and coach have been combined into the single role of a "Journey Guide"
- An interest survey was distributed and analyzed to facilitate the launching of new ACT groups
- 3 communication videos have been produced for introduction to and guidance through the Beta project for participants
- A strategic plan has also been developed

Phase Two Launch – New ACT groups

- Three new topics have been launched in Phase Two with the topics and participating regions shown below. Several groups expressed interest in launching new groups around common topics:
 - o Congregations of the future Maine, VT/NH, New York State, RI, IN-KY
 - o Regions of the future New England group, Ohio, possibly Michigan
 - Multicultural issues Evergreen, Rochester, Rocky Mountains, Indpls (Note: The multicultural group will be using an adapted version of the "Moving into the Neighborhood" material rather than the ACT guide)
- Key learnings from Phase One incorporated into Phase Two include:
 - o Groups who are able to meet face-to-face are more productive
 - o Because boundary spanning learning is a key to TbyS, only new topics with interest from multiple regions or entities will be launched
 - o Group coaching differs from individual coaching and will be emphasized in the training of coaches

God's Spirit is already beginning to work in new ways apart from the formal structures as evidenced by the activity springing up on its own in various parts of the ABC

- ABCUSA sponsored a conversation with the ABC seminary presidents and deans, focusing on adaptive change, one of the core components to TbyS
- Several regions have held their own version of a Mission Summit including ABCGI, Conn, Maine, West Virginia, VT/NH, and CPC
- The Asian Caucus held a series of Intergenerational Conversations
- Women in Ministry have made several strides in identifying barriers and gaining access for women in ministry
- Jay Kennedy has been called as the "Congregational Life Facilitator" for ABCGI
- The Ministers Council has launched a nation-wide survey studying pastoral attrition
- The Native American Indian gathering focused on TbyS style conversations at their annual assembly this summer as well as the ABC Seminarians Conference
