Sample Findings from the Pulpit and Pew Project

(Perceptions of the Laity)
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Expectations of clergy from the viewpoint of the laity...How do laity expect clergy in America to spend their time? (Respondents were asked to pick the top two)

- 1. Conducting Worship (66%)
- 2. Teaching (48%)
- 3. Visiting/Counseling (42%)
- 4. Praying for members (24%)
- 5. Administration (18%)
- 6. Providing Vision (13%)
- 7. Community Involvement (11%)
- 8. Training People (7%)
- 9. Converting Others (7%)

What do laity want in their next pastor? (Data drawn from interviews with pastoral search committees)

- 1. Good Preaching
 - Preaching that relates to life's concerns
 - Preaching that engages people on a personal level
- 2. Worship Leading
 - Style is important
 - Avoid previously bizarre behaviors
- 3. Strong Spiritual Leader
 - Was never well defined, but we'll know it when we see it
- 4. Commitment to the Parish
 - Desire a pastor to be "present" in the community...
 - But able to set limits
 - Expectations are the key
- 5. Good People Skills
 - Available, approachable, warm
 - Able to converse within the given culture
- 6. Gender, Race, Marriage
 - It is not in the top five, but search committees often prefer married male clergy in the ethnicity of the congregational majority
- 7. Age, Experience, Job tenures
 - Search committees also prefer young clergy with vast experience
- 8. Coach, Trainer
 - Laity want to be trained
- 9. Entrepreneurial, Innovative Leader
 - Laity recognize that congregational changes are needed
- 10. Transformational Leadership
