

## BRINGING IN THE NEW YEAR

"...For we brought nothing into the world, so that we can take nothing out of it, but if we have food and clothing, we will be content with these." (1 Timothy 6:7-8 NRSV)

We have become a culture of collectors. We know that in some cultures, status is given to those with access to water. In other cultures, higher standing is given to those with livestock.
