Crossroads American Baptist Church celebrated its 50th anniversary in June. "Our culture is serving others, with no expectation," notes Rev. Dr. Kim Skattum, Crossroads' senior pastor. "We serve and love them first, then share about Christ."

Crossroads promotes RMMO in November and collects the offering over Thanksgiving weekend or during the Thanksgiving service. They promote RMMO through letters from retired ministers within the congregation expressing thanks for the offering. Rev. Dr. Skattum reads them during the service and posts them on the church website. "We let people know what RMMO means. Simply put, people give because there is a need," noted Rev. Dr. Skattum.
