



United in Mission

Baptists in America have always been a people of mission. Mission describes who we are. Our United Mission contributions give concrete expression to this impulse and help us to be the hands and feet of Christ—from the local congregation to all parts of the world. The total of each congregation's giving through the American Baptist Churches USA is known as American Baptist Mission Support. The largest category of that support is United Mission.

The Region & United Mission

American Baptist Regions—composed of congregations that share a cause to serve Christ, often with a common geography like a state—receive 63.53% of United Mission dollars in a typical year. Your region is highly dependent upon United Mission giving. These gifts enable your region to provide more effective support for your church as it serves as the hands and feet of Christ and carries out its day-to-day ministries.

Specifically, with your United Mission giving, your region is able to provide:

- help with pastoral search committees;
- assistance with resolving church conflicts;
- resources to support your church in growth and spiritual health;
- education and training of pastors, youth and lay leaders in congregational empowerment;
- current information on American Baptist ministries at regional, national and international levels:
- regional gatherings for celebrations and sharing in the ministry.

Through United Mission giving, the Office of the General Secretary provides leadership support to regions through an Associate General Secretary



The Local Church & United Mission


United Mission allows the local church to join with other American Baptist churches to do collectively what it cannot do on its own. Baptist churches enter into a cooperating relationship as a way to help us all do the ministry to which God has called us. The collective financial support from local churches funds United Mission and extends the ministry of those churches beyond their local communities.

- United Mission giving is evangelism. It helps us share our faith in Christ so that others will have the opportunity to confess Jesus Christ as Lord and be baptized.

- *United Mission giving is the family.* It is a way for churches and individuals to give with confidence, knowing that their funds will be used for the whole ministry of American Baptist Churches USA.

The Office of the General Secretary & United Mission

The General Secretary works to carry out the descisions made by representatives from all phases of American Baptist life. The General Secretary also provides vision setting and coordination, resources, training, administration and counsel for the whole

denomination. Your giving to United Mission provides the funds this office needs to minister effectively. United Mission funds assist the General Secretary in representing the American Baptist family in national and international settings. A few examples demonstrate the positive impact of United Mission support to this important part of American Baptist ministry. The General Secretary:

- provides support for the American Baptist Representative Process and boards;
- maintains a close, collaborative relationship with local pastors, churches and regions to enhance the mission and ministry of American Baptist Churches USA as the hands and feet of Christ;
 - works to strengthen relationships and ministries with our overseas partners;
- endeavors to forge greater cooperation with other Baptist entities such as the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, The National Baptist Convention, The Progressive National Baptist Convention, and the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Convention;
- collaborates with the Baptist World Alliance, Christian Churches Together, and a variety of other ecumenical organizations ministering around the world in cooperation with other Christians to work for the cause of religious liberty, peace and social justice.

International Ministries & United Mission

International Ministries serves more than 2,500 short-term and long-term missionaries annually, bringing United States and Puerto Rico churches together with partners in 76 countries in cutting-edge ministries that tell the good news of Jesus Christ while meeting human needs. The Xtreme Team is an example of how International Ministries exposes some of our young people to missionary work.

National Ministries & United Mission

National Ministries answers God's call to live out Christian faith and transform individuals, congregations and communities by developing Christ-centered leadership, networks and programs committed to witness and evangelism, social justice, discipleship and mission work in the United States and Puerto Rico. More than 1,300 mission partners, working with National Ministries, minister to those in need—spiritually, emotionally, physically, and financially—every day as chaplains and pastoral counselors, refugee sponsors, directors of Christian centers, volunteers and new church planters.

Mission Resource Development & United Mission

Mission Resource Development, a ministry within the Office of the General Secretary, offers resources on stewardship, tithing and fundraising to local congregations. This helps them to become healthy, missional churches and to provide critical support for many organizations within American Baptist Churches USA. Mission Resource Development also has a wide scope of responsibilities for communications, including the denomination's Web site.

Representative Process & United Mission

The work of our General Board is vital in determining the direction of our denomination. The General Board, through our Representative Process, becomes the coordinating group for all of the autonomous organizations within American Baptist Churches USA. United Mission sustains this critical aspect of our ministry and mission.

Institutions & United Mission

Several regions have opted to include support of institutions with their United Mission budget. More than 120 institutions—colleges, universities, seminaries, hospitals, nursing homes and more—benefit from this support.

• Mission Initiative Fund & United Mission

This provides funding for launching new ministries and denomination-wide

mission activities beyond normal operating budgets.

Career Centers & United Mission

For those called to mission or ministry, American Baptist Churches USA offers continued career support with training centers, one-on-one career guidance and Webbased programs.



American Baptist Women's Ministries & United Mission

American Baptist Women's Ministries provides vision, leadership training and resources for women and girls in American Baptist churches to worship God, grow spiritually, develop spiritual gifts, care for one another, and reach out to others. Women and girls lead the organization and its ministries

locally, regionally and nationally. Recognizing a long heritage of mission support, American Baptist women and girls partner with Baptist mission worldwide through White Cross, Mission Encounter Tour programs and project funding. Love Gift, handled by American Baptist Women's Ministries, is an important component of our total United Mission budget.

• Operating Reserve & United Mission

Prudent people and organizations always save for the future. Our reserve helps us to meet unexpected expenses.

• American Baptist Churches Information Systems & United Mission

American Baptist Churches Information Systems provides vast data on churches, pastors, giving and regions, which can be easily accessed online anytime by all American Baptist Churches USA member churches and regions.

• American Baptist Men & United Mission

ABMen strives to fulfill the Great Commission and to reach men and boys for Christ. American Baptist Men brings hope to those whose lives have been devastated by natural disasters in the United States and Puerto Rico. American Baptist Boys & Young Men is the mentoring ministry of American Baptist Men.

• American Baptist Historical Society & United Mission

Since its founding in 1853, American Baptist

Historical Society has gathered the largest collection of Baptist materials, many irreplaceable, open to scholars for research.
