**Baptist World Alliance** is a fellowship of 231 conventions and unions in 121 countries and territories comprising of 42 million members in 177,000 churches. Baptist World Alliance is committed to:

- 2) Nurturing the passion for mission and evangelism
- Responding to human need through relief and sustainable community development
- 4) Defending human rights and justice
- 5) Promoting relevant theological reflection

This ecumenical advocacy group focuses on resolving the issues between Israel and Palestinians. Our mission is to encourage U.S. policies that actively promote a just, lasting, and comprehensive resolution of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, ensuring security, human rights and religious freedom for all the people of the region.

#### NATIONAL COUNCIL OF CHURCHES OF CHRIST

Founded in 1950, the National Council of the Churches of Christ in the USA has been a leading force for ecumenical cooperation among Christians in the United States. The 37 member communions—from a wide spectrum of Protestant, Anglican, Orthodox, Evangelical, historic African American and Living Peace churches—include 45 million persons in more than 100,000 local congregations in communities across the nation. They work to identify areas of belief they hold in common; they celebrate the diverse and unique gifts that each church brings to ecumenical life and together they study issues that divide the churches. They cooperate in many joint programs of education, advocacy and service that address critically important needs and witness to our common faith in Jesus Christ.

The NCC has long been active in social justice issues, including the Civil Rights Movement, Women's Rights, Peace Initiatives, Anti-apartheid efforts, eco-justice, Poverty.

#### THE WORLD COUNCIL OF CHURCHES

The World Council of Churches brings together churches, denominations and church fellowships in more than 110 countries and territories throughout the world, representing over 500 million Christians and including most of thie world's Orthodox churches, scores of Anglican, Baptist, Lutheran, Methodist and Reformed churches, as well as many United and Independent churches.

All World Council of Churches programs aim to support the member churches and ecumenical partners to journey together, promoting justice and peace in our world as an expression of faith in the Triune God. Today the WCC focuses its work in three program areas: **Unity, Mission and Ecuminical Relations, Public Witness and** *Diakonia* **and Ecumenical Formation.**

#### **OTHER EFFORTS**

#### **Baptist-Muslim Dialogue**

The Baptist-Muslim Dialogue is comprised of five Baptist denominations, including ABCUSA, and the Islamic Society of North American. The goal is to achieve mutual respect and through nanitonal, regional and local dialogues between Baptists and Muslims, focusing on helping each community move beyond stereotypes toward greater understanding; developing resources that would be helpful to congregations and mosques; and creating a body of theological dialogue that would help further the ability of both communities to consider how we together might work for peace and justice.

#### The Consultation on Common Texts:

An ecumenical consultation of liturgical scholars and denominational representatives from the United States and Canada, who produce liturgical texts for common use by North American Christian churches.

#### **Creation Justice Ministries:**

Educates, equips and mobilizes Christian communions/denominations, congregations and individuals to protect, restore, and rightly share God's Creation. Based on the priorities of its members, with a particular concern for the vulnerable and marginalized, Creation Justice Ministries provides collaborative opportunities to build ecumenical community, guides people of faith and faith communities toward eco-justice transformations, and raises a collective witness in the public arena echoing Christ's call for just relationships among all of Creation.

**The Lausanne Movement (Committee for World Evangelization)** is a global Movement that that mobilizes evangelical leaders to collaborate for world evangelization. The stated vision is "the whole church taking the whole gospel to the whole world."

**UN Commission on the Status of Women:** Engages in global women's issues through the ecumenical movement. It includes the elimination and prevention of all forms of violence against women and girls.

**Shoulder-to-Shoulder Campaign:** Is an interfaith organization dedicated to ending anti-Muslim sentiment by strengthening the voice of freedom and peace.

### 10 Facts You Should Know About American Baptists

- 1) American Baptists believe that Jesus Christ is Lord and Savior, and that the Bible is the divinely inspired word of God that serves as the final written authority for living out the Christian faith.
- 2) For American Baptists the local church is the fundamental unit of mission in denominational life.
- 3) American Baptists partake of two ordinances: Believers' Baptism and The Lord's Supper.
- 4) American Baptists believe that the committed individual Christian can and should approach God directly, and that individual gifts of ministry should be shared.
- 5) American Baptists take seriously the call to evangelism and missionary work.
- 6) American Baptists support religious freedom and respect the expressions faith of others.
- American Baptists acknowledge that God's family extends beyond our local churches, and that God calls us to cooperative ministries.
- 8) American Baptists have been called to be Christ's witnesses for justice and wholeness within a broken society.


