The chief development, relief and refugee resettlement arm of the churches related to the National Council of Churches.

CHURCHES FOR MIDDLE EAST PEACE

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF EVANGELICALS

This group has not had public assemblies for a number of years. ABC is an observer because their bylaws exclude any denomination affiliated with the NCC/WCC. The General Board took action several years ago to say that ABCUSA would have observers present at their meetings. We have continued to make contact with them in other settings where we sit at the same table. Through conversations at Edinburgh 2010, we were issued an invitation to send an ABC observer to the Cape Town 2010 meeting of the Lausanne Movement.

Baptist-Muslim Dialogue

The Baptist-Muslim dialogue is comprised of five Baptist denominations, including ABCUSA; and the Islamic Society of North America (ISNA). The goal is to achieve mutual respect and through national, regional and local dialogues between Baptists and Muslims, focusing on helping each community move beyond stereotypes toward greater understanding; developing resources that would be helpful to congregations and mosques; and creating a body of theological dialogue that would help further the ability of both communities to consider how we together might work for peace and justice.

The Consultation on Common Texts (CCT)

An ecumenical consultation of liturgical scholars and denominational representatives from the United States and Canada, who produce liturgical texts for common use by North American Christian churches.

Creation Justice Ministries

Educates, equips and mobilizes Christian communions/denominations, congregations and individuals to protect, restore, and rightly share God's Creation. Based on the priorities of its members, with a particular concern for the vulnerable and marginalized, Creation Justice Ministries provides collaborative opportunities to build ecumenical community, guides people of faith and faith communities towards eco-justice transformations, and raises a collective witness in the public arena echoing Christ's call for just relationships among all of Creation.

Though its ministry is explicitly Christian, they are not exclusively Christian and welcome partnership and collaboration with those feel called to care of God's Creation regardless of religious affiliation.

The Lausanne Movement (Committee for World Evangelization)

Global Movement that mobilizes evangelical leaders to collaborate for world evangelization. The stated vision is "the whole church taking the whole gospel to the whole world".

The Lausanne Movement grew out of the <u>1974 International Congress on World Evangelization</u> (ICOWE) and promotes active worldwide <u>evangelism</u>. The <u>Lausanne Covenant</u> provides the theological basis for collaborative work in the area of mission and evangelism. The Cape Town Commitment defines the movement's goals.

NCC Delegation to the UN Commission on the Status of Women

Church Women United, Inc. (CWU) and The National Council of the Churches of Christ in the USA (NCC) engage in global women's issues through the ecumenical movement. It includes the elimination and prevention of all forms of violence against women and girls.

In July 2010, the United Nations General Assembly created UN Women, the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women. In doing so, UN Member States took an historic step in accelerating the Organization's goals on gender equality and the empowerment of women. The creation of UN Women came about as part of the UN reform agenda, bringing together resources and mandates for greater impact. It merges and builds on the important work of four previously distinct parts of the UN system, which focused exclusively on gender equality and women's empowerment.

Shoulder-to-Shoulder Campaign

Shoulder-to-Shoulder is an interfaith organization dedicated to ending anti-Muslim sentiment by strengthening the voice of freedom and peace. Founded in November 2010 by over 20 national religious groups, Shoulder-to-Shoulder works not only on a national level, but offers strategies and support to local and regional efforts to address anti-Muslim sentiment and seeks to spread the word abroad.
