ABHMS Continues Hurricane Sandy Relief Efforts

VALLEY FORGE, PA (ABNS 12/11/12)— American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS) continues to respond to the needs of churches and individuals in American Baptist regions that were affected when Hurricane Sandy hit the East Coast on Oct. 29. The following information includes reports from regional offices to ABHMS' Volunteer and Disaster Response Office.

Connecticut

American Baptist Churches of Connecticut reports minor to moderate flooding and wind damage at Calvary Baptist Church, South Norwalk; Putnam Baptist Church; First Baptist Church (FBC), Branford; and Silliman Memorial Baptist Church and FBC, both in Bridgeport. In addition, regional offices and the region camp also sustained damage. A \$10,000 One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) emergency domestic grant has been released to the region.

Massachusetts

American Baptist Churches of Massachusetts reports that two churches—Eglise Evangelique de l'Union Chretienne, Brockton, and FBC, New Bedford—sustained extensive roof damage. The release of OGHS funds is pending assessment.

New Jersev

American Baptist Churches of New Jersey (ABCNJ) reports that 50 churches have sustained damage, ranging from minor to major. Many churches have become mission stations, serving communities as supply distribution centers, food providers, shelters for the homeless and volunteers, and worship sites for damaged churches. ABCNJ has received \$70,000 in OGHS emergency domestic disaster grants and has disbursed \$64,128.69 to ministries, individuals and 34 congregations. Specifically, \$37,775.95 is being used to assist church members and communities; \$19,836.63 for facility repairs and damage; \$4,550 for pastor relief and assistance; \$1,902 for hosting groups and pastors from around the state; and \$1,966.11 for Camp Lebanon.

New York

The Metro New York region reports damage at Flemister House, Mariners' Temple Baptist Church and Huntington Baptist Church. Assessment continues at other churches. Many churches are collecting donations for countless individuals affected by the hurricane. Assessments are

pending from churches in Staten Island and other areas. In addition, the region is partnering with Church World Service to collect and distribute kits for babies, hygiene and schools. A \$10,000 OGHS emergency domestic grant has been released to the region.

Other Areas

In addition, minor damage was reported in Rhode Island, Ohio, Pennsylvania and West Virginia.

Remaining Needs

While select volunteers have assisted, no national call for volunteers has been issued for lack of volunteer housing and ground support resources.

- gift cards from grocery stores—such as ShopRite, Acme and Foodtown—as well as from home-improvement and department stores, such as Lowe's, Home Depot, Sears, Walmart and Target.

In addition, financial support is needed to continue relief efforts. Approximately \$12,000 in gifts has been received by OGHS for Hurricane Sandy relief.
