Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions, rainy day funds, church benevolent funds, regular ongoing church operating expenses (i.e. utilities, insurance), repairs, or for capital improvements or repairs to facilities. Grant awards will be sent to the ABC church that is applying for the grant; checks will not be made payable to an individual or ministry.

Checks will be made payable to the church. Checks will not be made to an individual or ministry.

# **CenterPoint Church "Blessing Bag" Project 2018**

**Vision:** is to become a community centered in the Transformative Gospel of Jesus Christ **Mission:** No Judgment No Shame Just Love

CenterPoint exist to be a gathering, not a building; a collective effort of exploring and living out faith. Whether a service with a standard liturgy or simply fellowship over a meal, it is where we encounter the hearts and minds of people to Deconstruct Church and Resurrect Community.

## PREMISE

Maintaining personal hygiene is necessary for many reasons; personal, social, health, psychological and simply as a way of life. Keeping a good standard of hygiene helps to prevent the development and spread of infections, illnesses and bad odors. Most women are very conscious of personal hygiene because they are aware of health problems that can develop as a result of poor personal hygiene

## PROBLEM

The latest analysis on women's poverty (The Women's Foundation) reveals a discouraging but wellknown story for those of us interested in the issue. Years into the economic recovery and poverty rates are still on the rise for women. The number of women living in poverty in the Washington, DC region increased once again—from 10.2 percent in 2013 to 10.6 percent in 2014. The highest poverty rates continue to exist in Wards 7 and 8, where one-in-three residents lived below the poverty line in 2012.

## PROPOSAL

CenterPoint serves as a ministry in the Ward 8 community where both physical and spiritual needs are ministered too. The proposed program is a platform for community outreach serving as a conduit to fulfill the church mandate to provide for the less fortunate.

CenterPoint "Blessing Bag" Project is a missional outreach initiative providing personal hygiene care packages that include items, such as, deodorant, mouth care products, soaps, and feminine toiletries. In the 2016, with generous support from the Matthew 25 grant, Progressive National Baptist Convention, Inc. and crowd funding, CenterPoint provided over 400 "Blessing Bags" to women in the Ward 8 communities of Washington, DC. In 2017, efforts had reach 500 bags assembled and distributed

By 2018 CenterPoint provided 1000 "Blessing Bags" to underserved women, more than doubling its previous year efforts. These "Blessing Bags" served women living in Section 8 housing, homeless shelters, senior living facilities and regrettably on the street. Its partnerships included additional churches, community groups and non-profit organizations, providing volunteers to collect, assemble and distribute donations.

## PROPOSITION

CenterPoint seeks to continue in its effort to:

- 1. Serve underserve women with personal hygiene items
- 2. Coincided with the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Service
- 3. Provide opportunities for youth to gain volunteer community service hours
- 4. Build partnerships with additional community stakeholders

With a target of 1500 "Blessing Bags" for 2019, CenterPoint is requesting financial support from the Matthew 25 Grant in the amount of \$5000.00. Each "Blessing Bag" has a cost of approximately \$5.00 per unit. 100% of monies collected to fund this project are used solely for the benefit of the recipients.
