VISION STATEMENT - Impacting Lives One At A Time (Luke 4:18-19).

<u>MISSION STATEMENT</u> - To transform communities through Spiritual Renewal, Social Change and Economic Empowerment (Luke 4:18-19).

CenterPoint is a gathering of people in process, a place where the curious, the broken and the used-to-believe, meet the committed, informed and the sold-out.

PREMISE

Feeding programs are known to serve as a pillar for ministry in urban settings. These outreach programs are of great benefit to the body, and thereby help to lift the spirit of the children, youth and families served. When hunger is eliminated and malnutrition diminished, families are able to live a healthier lifestyle.

PROBLEM

According to the DC Fiscal Policy Institute, in 2012, just over 18 percent of DC residents—108,732 people—lived below the poverty line, which is less than \$23,492 for a family of four. The highest poverty rates continue to exist in Wards 7 and 8, where one-in-three residents lived below the poverty line in 2012. According to Kids Count, the poverty rate of children in Ward 8 in 2013 was 50.6%

PROPOSAL

CenterPoint serves as a ministry in the Ward 8 community where both physical and spiritual needs are ministered too. The proposed feeding program is a platform for community outreach. It will serve not only a conduit to bring families to the knowledge of Christ, but primarily as an opportunity to fulfill the church mandate to feed the hungry.

CenterPoint proposes to establish and operate a "Blessing Bag" food project primarily for children, youth and families living in Ward 8 Washington, DC. These families include people living in Section 8 housing, homeless shelters, senior living facilities and regrettably on the streets. There are so many ways to help eliminate hunger in Washington, DC. One could donate financially to offer hope through life changing ministries, invest time, talents and professional expertise as a volunteer, organize a collection drive for needed food items through the office, school or organizations.

Another way is to prepare Blessing Bags. Blessing Bags meet immediate, daily needs while offering families hope. Not everyone has food. Not everyone can just go to the pantry and grab something to eat. Having to struggle for basic necessities, along with having to deal with other factors of poverty is incredibly difficult. So, CenterPoint seeks to create Blessing Bags with nonperishable food items. These Blessing Bags will accomplish to primary objectives:

- **1. Feed Their Needs -** One of the greatest gifts you can give to someone who is hungry is food to nourish their bodies. Food like granola bars, crackers with peanut butter, trail mixes, dried fruits, and a bottle of water are great items to tuck into the "Blessing Bags."
- **2. Feed Their Souls -** Feeding someone's soul is just as important as feeding their needs. CenterPoint has created a local resources list that families can tap into for further resources. In addition, a note of encouragement and a comforting scripture.
