USE OF THE MATTHEW 25 GRANT MONIES

FREE COMMUNITY LUNCH: For the last year and have, we have hosted a free community lunch on the last Saturday of each month. We serve approximately 25-30 people each month. We have not incorporated the free lunch into our overall budget. We rely solely upon the generosity and kindness of the members of the congregation to make food donations to support this outreach effort. If we consider that you can receive a good lunch for about \$7.50/person (on average), it would cost us approximately \$225/month to serve 30 people.

But we also have a desire to reach more people. So the Matthew 25 Grant monies would also be used to do some more "marketing" of the lunch. We do a lot of advertising for free but possibly a paid advertisement or something professional done might attract more people.

FAMILY FUNDAY: For the last 3 years, we have sponsored an outreach activity we call "Family FunDay." (It is held during the month of September.) It is an outreach effort in which we strive to meet the physical, spiritual and familial needs of the members of our community. Everything we offer is FREE. And last year's event started a new trend of incorporating representatives from public service organizations (Corning Fire Department, Steuben County Sheriff's Department, Steuben County Public Health Nursing). We offer free food (hot dogs, cotton candy, popcorn, drinks, chips), games (with prizes), ID kits for children, safety demonstrations by the Fire Department, a free craft, tracts for the children and adults, 15 free grand prizes (15 individual, hand-made bags FULL of school supplies) and a special invitation to worship the next day followed by an old-fashioned ice cream social.

While Family FunDay is a line item on our budget, some extra monies could help us "take it up a notch." We could possibly rent some carnival games from local vendors, offer hotdogs AND hamburgers, increase the number of grand prizes, reach a broader group of people, etc.

We thank you, in advance for considering our request.





> **Lighting** system was maintained, including the stocking of 300 watt incandescent sanctuary bubs adequate for at least 2 years, as legal low wattage options are being developed by industry.

Church Hospitality/Safety:

- Child Care room and storage areas needs were maintained or upgraded. Basement childcare storage area walls were cleaned and painted for the first time since the 1970's. Electrical receptacles and lighting were added in case the basement area is needed for a wind storm safety retreat area again.
- Worked with Church Photo Directory task group , including Sean Masteller photo service (voluntary), using "Instant Church Directory" software, to develop & post individual photos of willing church members.
- > **Carpet Cleaning** routine was started using new donated church owned commercial sized carpet shampooer and spot dry powder carpet cleaner picked up with our new Kenmore vacuum cleaner.
- Family Fun Day was supported as requested. Also dead growth was trimmed from shrubs and trees for general appearance and safety.
- Canvas tenting, used for Family Fun Day food serving cover and also for other outside events, was donated to the church by Beverly and Tom Dates.

Property Maintenance:

- Worship sound and projection cabinet & equipment was upgraded, including cabinet modification to accommodate a more capable (refurbished) computer and Easy Worship software, working with Richard Herrick, our in house electrical and computer expert.
- > Outside Bulletin Board Cleaned and rewired.

- **Kitchen faucet** replaced.
- Building air change intake was given an upgraded thermal barrier door designed, built and installed to limit winter cold air from entering metal ducting.

The Pastoral Search Committee met regularly throughout 2012.

During the year we reviewed several Pastor Profiles, sent out inquiries and communicated with various pastors. After prayerful study, we agreed that one particular pastor, Rev. Mary C. Lewis, had many of the qualities we were looking for in our next pastor and should be considered as a possible candidate for our church.

During the spring and early summer, Rev. Lewis and the Search Committee communicated numerous times. We both felt that there were many positive reasons to continue discussions. So to get to know each other better, we agreed to set up a "neutral pulpit." On Sunday, July 29, the Search Committee traveled to the Reading Center Baptist Church to observe Rev. Lewis as she led the worship and preached. After the worship service, we had an informal get-together with her including lunch in an area restaurant. In the weeks following, the Committee met to evaluate and discuss our observations. As a result we unanimously agreed that we thought Rev. Lewis met all of our requirements and would be a good "fit" with our congregation. And fortunately for us, Rev. Lewis believed that she was being called to Corning First Baptist and thought that a ministry with our church met with her future plans. She then consented to have her name brought before our congregation as our next permanent pastor.

A "Candidate Week-end" was scheduled for October 19-21, with different times available for Rev. Lewis and the congregation to get to know one another. Then at the October 21, 2012, Congregational Meeting, the members of the church overwhelmingly elected Rev. Mary C. Lewis to be our next permanent pastor. During discussions after the election, Pastor Mary agreed to begin her ministry with us on January 1, 2013.

We thank God for leading us in this endeavor, and we are very grateful that He gave us the patience to find just the right person to work and walk with us in His ministry here in this church.
