Our Church Treasurer reports that during 2012 we received \$219 in monetary donations toward the Camden Mission. \$4,381.00 was disbursed from the 2012 budget toward the Camden Mission project to cover weekly expenses (water, meat and cheese, fruit, sandwich bags, foil wrappers, napkins).

In addition to monetary donations, we regularly receive donations of food:

- \* bread, hot dog and hamburger rolls are provided free each week as needed through the generosity of Strohman Bakery warehouse in Delaware. They make available bread returned to their warehouse with close or already past expiration dates. Because we use the bread the same day it is picked up, it is still in usable condition when received.
  - \* cookies are donated weekly for inclusion in the 100 lunches provided.
- \* During the school year a class at Woodbury High School comes to the church one Friday a month and students are taught to make a variety of foods. Those foods are provided to the Camden Mission for inclusion in the lunches. Provided by the students have been soup (chicken vegetable, cream of chicken, clam chowder, vegetable beef), macaroni & cheese, chili, potato salad, cupcakes, cookies and muffins. The hot soup is a great addition to the lunches on a cold day, and it's always a joy to provide fresh baked goods.
- \* On holidays we often provide a special treat for our recipients Christmas cookies, chocolates for Valentine's Day, etc. These items have always been donated for our recipients' enjoyment.

It is such a privilege and pleasure to be able to serve God's people by providing lunches for them each Saturday. I appreciate your consideration of our project in your Grant program.

Sandwiches are accompanied by a bottle of water, a sweet – maybe cookies, muffins or cupcakes, and a piece of fruit. As often as possible we provide hard-boiled eggs, which are gratefully received. We provide soup during the cold winter months, as well as coffee occasionally, and maybe baked beans. During the hot summer months the line is long when we bring water ice to dish out. When available year-round, we take gently-used clothing, coats, socks, shoes and blankets for those that need them.

God has richly blessed this ministry. I am so thankful to those that so willingly and faithfully give up their Saturday mornings to serve in this venture. We are so grateful to Central Baptist Church that the Camden Mission is included in the church budget so that funds are available enabling us to continue this work. We continue to covet your prayers as we serve as Christ's hands and feet.
