We will no longer award grants to organizations affiliated with churches such as a cooperative group that includes non-ABC churches; applications must be submitted by an ABC church for work being done directly by that church.



Only one application per church will be considered within a 24-month period. Because this change was made following the Fall 2016 cycle, recipients of a Spring 2016 grant are eligible to apply.

Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions, rainy day funds, church benevolent funds, regular ongoing church operating expenses (i.e. utilities, insurance), repairs, or for capital improvements to facilities. Grant awards will be sent to the ABC church that is applying for the grant; checks will not be made payable to an individual or ministry.

Our mission is to love God and love our neighbors through an after school program for our community's children nurturing their whole lives—mind, body and spirit.

After School Kids is a new ministry of Community Baptist Church of Whitefield, New Hampshire, which will provide a safe, nurturing environment for children in grades 4-8, Monday through Friday during the school year from 3:15pm until 5:30pm. We seek to create a place where children and adults interact with mutual respect and honesty, free from harmful words and actions. We strive to love our young neighbors and their families by promoting physical, intellectual, emotional, and spiritual growth. Our goal will always be to love others as we have been loved by the Lord.

The program will be based at Community Baptist Church on Jefferson Road in Whitefield, NH. Children can arrive on the school bus from Whitefield Elementary School. We will utilize the large lawn for active outdoor play and group games, and the handicapped-accessible fellowship hall and stage area for inside activities.

Addressing physical needs: Each day, children will be provided a nutritious snack as part of ASK. In addition, one day per week will include a cooking activity, teaching fun ways to use healthy ingredients and provide good food for themselves. Once a month, the kids of ASK will work together to prepare and serve a free community meal to which they may invite their families and others. Also, we have a large and safe outdoor area for active, physical play, something not easily accessible in our village. We will encourage active play to promote wellness.

Addressing intellectual needs: Knowledgeable and capable adults will be available each day for homework help, a need which many of the parents have expressed. We will offer enriching activities such as music, arts and crafts, science experiments, first aid training, and special guests such as meteorologists or game wardens.

Addressing emotional needs: The lack of a consistent, safe place for the after-school hours is a major source of stress in school-aged children. Our ministry will seek to alleviate this stress. Staff and volunteers will receive training in child safety practices, and listening and mentoring skills, and provide a compassionate listening ear to children who need one. Both men and women will be involved every day, providing positive Christian role models.

Addressing spiritual needs: Each day will begin with a brief, interactive devotion centered on a "word of the day," such as compassion, patience, kindness, generosity. Each will have a Scriptural basis and a practical application. At least once a week, the pastor will be present for "ASK me Anything," when kids can bring up big or small questions about God, the church, or life issues. ASK will also offer spiritually-focused activities, such as movie or book discussion, producing Christmas or other holiday plays, and more.

Our hope is that children and families involved with ASK will be impacted for the Kingdom of God through meeting the physical, intellectual, emotional, and spiritual needs of our community.
