RADICAL HOSPITALITY AT FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH, McMinnville, Oregon MISSION STATEMENT

First Baptist Church, McMinnville, OR, is a downtown church with a program of hospitality to those who visit on Monday and Friday mornings from 9:00-11:00 am. Our visitors include those with mental illnesses, with addiction issues, homeless, unemployed, underemployed and those dealing with poverty. As a church, we offer refuge, safety and services to assist those who are less fortunate. In the first eight months of operation, we provided services to over1250 individuals (duplicate count). We seek a Matthew 25 Grant of \$4,857 to use for our Radical Hospitality Project.

The name of our program is STAR----Serving Those ARound us. We began in December 2013. Our Official Board has endorsed our goals and plans for the next three years. We are called to be a Matthew 25 Church and our long-range goals are inspired by the words of Jesus, "Whatever you do unto the least of my sisters and brothers, you do unto me." STAR is the largest initiative undertaken as a result of our Renewal Planning and Implementation begun in 2013 with the consideration of this statement:

"Where are we being called to make God's presence accessible, available, visible and understandable given the resources we have at hand and the audiences we are called to engage?"

Attached please find our June 2014 report to American Baptist Churches, USA, and our congregational report dated August 2014. During these 9 months, we have determined that our daily operational costs total \$ 3,000. Additional monies are spent on school supplies for children, yarn for making "winter warmers" for our visitors and shoes and coats for children and adults. Our FBC Fellowship Fund continues to offer laundry cards and we began giving one-day bus passes.

We offer breakfast each day---hard boiled eggs, toast, cereal, milk, juice, coffee, tea, yogurt, fresh fruit, peanut butter, jelly. Two volunteers provide sandwiches one day each week for our guests to take with them. We have received many donations of food from the local community and FBC members. A local coffee shop gives us a large thermos of coffee on Mondays and Fridays. A variety of clothing is distributed each day and includes socks. We offer a shower on a sign-up basis with one volunteer accompanying them downstairs to our shower facility.

Dedicated volunteers have staffed the STAR Room; an average of five volunteers work daily. As our numbers continue to increase, we are looking at future plans for another room in the church and more volunteers for our STAR Ministry. Currently we have two monetary donations to continue our efforts in 2014-2015, and intend to secure more. Our plans for 2015 are to continue this ministry and engage other downtown churches to provide breakfast on other days of the week.

Many of our visitors express their appreciation for our efforts to meet their needs. Volunteers establish individual relationships with our visitors by sitting down and drinking coffee with them. We listen carefully and encourage our guests. They build their confidence to trust us. Many of our visitors have made changes in their behavior and have a smile now. One wrote in her thank you card, "Thank you for all you do to help people like me. I did not expect a church to listen to my story and actually assist me." Some have asked us to pray with them, several have asked us for a Bible, some have attended church services, many offer to help us carry in the food items, vacuum, clean up after breakfast and be helpful. Our STAR Ministry is successful and constantly increasing in numbers who come to us. We are grateful for the support of ABC.USA.
