3. Community Kitchen Use of Funds

As followers of Jesus, we at FBC Shelburn believe it is unacceptable that people go hungry in our community, especially since God has blessed us so much with plenty to share. The Shelburn community is located in Sullivan County, one of the areas of Indiana with the highest unemployment rates, highest poverty rates, and highest rates of children receiving free or reduced lunches. While we realize that we cannot alleviate all the negative issues in our community, we want to do as much as we can to impact the lives of those living right outside the doors of our church. To that end, the Shelburn Community Kitchen Ministry was born on April 12, 2011.

Recognizing the fact that one of the immediate needs of our community was for some assistance in putting food on the table, we opened our Ministry Center to anyone who wanted to come for a free nutritious meal in a safe, friendly environment. With teams of volunteers (there are no paid staff positions), we have been able to host a community dinner every Tuesday evening from 5:30pm to 7:00pm (or until the food runs out), varying each week from a list of nine different menus (see attached). Each week the number of meals served ranges from approximately 70 to 120+. No one is turned away, and so far we have been able to provide enough food for everyone who attends, often including second and third servings. We also deliver 10 to 18 meals weekly to the local senior citizens housing units and other shut-ins in the community. There are no questions asked or restrictions for attendance, and participants are not obligated to our church in any way.

One of the unexpected benefits of this ministry has been the social interaction opportunities it offers to both community and church members. In addition to helping to alleviate hunger, the Community Kitchen dinner gives participants a place to gather to visit with friends, relatives, and folks from our church. Many of those who attend are older widowed men and women for whom this dinner offers a reprieve from loneliness or isolation. It also, on occasion, offers opportunities for local teenagers to fulfill community service hours within a well-chaperoned and Christian atmosphere.

If we are blessed with funds from the ABCUSA Matthew 25 Grant, all of it will be used to purchase food and the other miscellaneous supplies that are needed to host the Community Kitchen dinners each week. We have witnessed firsthand the gratitude with which this ministry is received, and many have openly expressed how much these meals help with their family food budgets. Any financial assistance we receive will be designated specifically for the furtherance of this ministry, offering hope and help in a tangible way to the people of our community.
