

ABCUSA MATTHEW 25 GRANT APPLICATION

A generous donor has given a sum of money through American Baptist Churches USA to be used for programs that address "housing, feeding, education and health with regard to the less fortunate." A panel will select recipients for grants of up to \$5,000 largely based on the degree to which the funds will be used to directly assist persons in poverty. Ministries must be in relationship with American Baptist Churches USA to be eligible to apply, and only one application per church or ministry will be considered per year. Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions.

FOCUS Churches of Albany is a faith based non-profit established in 1967. The ecumenical membership is comprised of 7 covenant churches, including Emmanuel Baptist Church. This congregation also provides a home base for the FOCUS administrative offices and the FOCUS Interfaith Food Pantry. Emmanuel Baptist provides 3 members to the governing body and has many parishioners who volunteer in FOCUS programs.

Food Empowerment Project 2014

Our Goal: We will strengthen families to have more control over access to fresh produce, and the ability to grow vegetables and enjoy locally grown produce. The project goal is to empower low income individuals in Albany, who experience food insecurity, to learn how to grow, cook, and have access to and choices for an adequate supply of safe, nutritious, and appropriate food items.

FOCUS Food Empowerment Project will reach for our goal through 3 specific components:

1. Gardening In A Bucket – Seed and Seedling Distribution (GIAB). 350 households have access to resources at our daily food pantry. GIAB provides a clay pot with drainage holes, organic dirt and assorted vegetable seedlings, along with hands-on instructions. Pantry guests may obtain more than 1 pot. We will also provide a seasonal Seed and Seedling distribution among pantry guests and distribute 500 seedlings and 100 seed packets.

Gardening in A Bucket – For Kids! is geared toward 7-12 year olds. Staff and volunteers teach kids about urban gardening with hands-on participation. Outreach is done to youth in surrounding urban neighborhoods, low income children in homeless shelters and city schools. Last season we took the planting event to 2 homeless shelters, 3 elementary schools and an urban day camp. We will provide 100 kids 200 seedlings and potting accessories.

2. Food Demonstrations will be conducted on a weekly basis at the pantry site. Our local cooperative extension will provide expert cooking and nutrition seminars that utilize locally grown foods. 100 participants will take home food items and recipes.
3. FOCUS Community Harvest Garden is a 600 square foot plot that is utilized for community, production, and harvest. Operating from April to October providing guests and volunteers experience in planning, planting, nurturing and harvesting 700 lbs. of produce for distribution at the Food Pantry.

In tandem with the Food Empowerment Project FOCUS will offer households information and referrals to federal nutrition assistance programs and other local assistance programs; advocate for just and fair public policies to improve the programs that support those in need of food assistance, and similarly, policies that empower economic security for those living in poverty.
