A panel will select recipients for grants of up to \$5,000. Awards will be granted only to ministries of an American Baptist church in good standing with their Region. This is a change from previous grant cycles. We will no longer award grants to organizations affiliated with churches such as a cooperative group that includes non-ABC churches; applications must be submitted by an ABC church for work being done directly by that church.



Only one application per church will be considered within a 24-month period.

Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions, rainy day funds, church benevolent funds, regular ongoing church operating expenses (i.e. utilities, insurance), repairs, or for capital improvements or repairs to facilities. Grant awards will be sent to the ABC church that is applying for the grant; checks will not be made payable to an individual or ministry.

 The Federated Church is known as a very caring and mission-minded church with an emphsis on helping our local children. Our town our county has no homeless shelter. The closest

shelter is 40 miles away (Alton, IL). The Pastor has been using a portion of her discretionary funds to help cover housing costs for one or two days at a local motel for a homeless individual or two. One person was trying to stay in the area because of an upcoming job interview! We have also been approached by a few local single mothers with 2 to 3 children who had full time jobs but could just not stretch their income to quite pay unexpected bills, or school registration costs. We are trying to offer help to those who are trying to help themselves, but need a little extra boost, to reach their goal. The impact we are striving for is acknowledgement of their need, of our concern for them, and that we do want to help if at all

possible. The Pastor attempts to assess the individual's whole situation, not just the one "need". By doing that, she is often able to direct the person to other local agencies which may be able to offer guidance and support.

When determining Grants awards, the following criteria will be considered: whether the church is in good standing within the region; whether the church contributes to United Mission; number of and amounts of previous Matthew 25 Grants received; sustainability of ministry beyond Matthew 25 Grant funding; description of ministry and needs addressed by funding; and the budget submitted along with this application.

Checks will be made payable to the church. Checks will not be made to an individual or ministry.

#3. Specifically, how do you plan to use the requested funds? (Additional information limited to no more than one page in length and submitted as an attachment.)

The Federated Church is located in Carlinville. IL which is the county seat and largest "city" in Macoupin County. Whereas the county's main industry in the past was coal mining, the mines are mostly closed now. The current primary industry in the county is agriculture.

The *IL Report Card (2016-2017) for Carlinville Unit School District #1* reports that 48.4% of the district are "low-income" students, that being "families receiving public aid, living in substitute care, or eligible to receive free or reduced price lunches." This level has increased over the past 5 years from 42% to the 2017 level of 48.4%. The same 2017 report also shows an increase from 3% to 4% of the district's students as being "homeless", those being defined as "those students who do not have permanent or adequate homes".

The local Food Pantry has seen an increase in clients the past year and is in almost constant need of supplies. The Carlinville School District this year, for the first time ever, collected funds to buy *new shoes* for needy students in the district. That was along with furnishing backpacks and school supplies to those students. The Federated Church, for the last six years has offered an eight-week, free summer lunch program. This summer (2018) we served 3939 meals in 39 days – an increase of 300 more meals than last summer (2017).

The Federated Church has also seen an increase in need from those who come to our church door to ask for help. Our Pastor and church secretary have developed a page of questions to help them gather the needed information to verify, and confirm, the person's needs and requests for help. For instance, an appeal for help in paying a power bill requires one to furnish the bill with their name on it. This also leads to the calling of the power company to see if a payment plan can be set up. This type of reviewing of their whole life situation gives our Pastor the opportunity to suggest other possible services or agencies in our Carlinville area that may be able to offer support or help.

Many requests are denied because the need cannot be verified or, because the requested funds are more than we can offer. Our Pastor is in contact with other local churches and social service agencies in town trying to get them to all work together to help fund the needs and offer services to those that come to our door. Many times a request for help is funded through several churches combining funds. In the past year the Federated Church has helped pay mainly on housing, utilities (power, water), and medications.

Just recently, however, the Federated Church has received calls from two local social services agencies asking <u>us</u> to help two of their clients -- *because the agencies themselves are out of funding*. The Federated Church Pastor's discretionary monies have been added to throughout the first seven months of this year from our mission budget. If requests continue at the same rate as the first seven months of 2018, we will be using \$2500 to \$3000 this year helping to fill those requests for help. It is a scary, frustrating position to be in of deciding who needs your funding, help and support the most.
