Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions, rainy day funds, church benevolent funds, regular ongoing church operating expenses (i.e. utilities, insurance), repairs, or for capital improvements or repairs to facilities. Grant awards will be sent to the ABC church that is applying for the grant; checks will not be made payable to an individual or ministry.

Our neighbors who attend our monthly free community dinners include residents of a senior apartment complex, including many reserved for low-income tenants; residents of a low-income apartment complex; and many other low- and middle- income people in our neighborhood. For those receiving food stamps, there are many non-food items that are essential to quality of life, such as toiletries and cleaning supplies. At a time when many of our neighbors' food stamp allowances are being cut, we hope to supply some of their non-food essentials, to help stretch their budgets. Also, by purchasing fresh vegetables from a local farm, Homesteads for Hope, we are supporting the farm, which provides work experience for adults with disabilities, and we are providing fresh produce for our neighbors who might not otherwise be able to afford healthy, local food.

When determining Grants awards, the following criteria will be considered: whether the church is in good standing within the region; whether the church contributes to United Mission; number of and amounts of previous Matthew 25 Grants received; sustainability of ministry beyond Matthew 25 Grant funding; description of ministry and needs addressed by funding; and the budget submitted along with this application.

Checks will be made payable to the church. Checks will not be made to an individual or ministry.

Community Dinner Outreach: Gift Bag Ministry

Greece Baptist Church serves a community dinner on the first Sunday of each month, October through May. The dinners are free and open to the public. Our guests include many seniors and others in our community on fixed and low incomes. People come for company, and to help stretch their monthly food budgets.

The dinners are prepared and served by volunteers from our church and community. They are funded by a \$100 annual donation from Wegman's Foods, a \$500 annual grant from the Weber Family Trust, \$250 from the Greece Baptist Mission board, and individual food and monetary donations from church and community members.

Church members also attend the dinners to converse with our guests and learn about their situations. We often hear that many of our neighbors are seeing their food stamp allowances being cut. In asking what they need, they request toiletries and cleaning supplies: things they can't buy with food stamps. They need items such as toilet paper, dish soap, bar soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, dental floss, dish towels and cloths, wash cloths, window cleaner, and other cleaners. By supplementing these non-food items, we hope to help their food budgets stretch further.

Greece Baptist Church has also formed a relationship with Homesteads for Hope, a new local farm whose mission is to provide a distinctive place to learn, work, live and grow for people of all abilities in the Greater Rochester Region. Specifically, they provide work experience and opportunities for adults with disabilities.

We would like to give our guests a gift bag as they leave from the community dinner as follows:

2018 November: vegetables from Homesteads for Hope.

2018 December: toiletries/cleaning supplies

2019 January through May: toiletries/cleaning supplies

2019 October and November: vegetables from Homesteads for Hope.

Other items may include hats, scarves, and gloves knitted by church and community members; and both non-perishable and prepared food from the kitchen.

Since we have 50-60 people at each dinner, with 10-20 being church members and volunteers, we will need about 40 gift bags at each dinner.
