We will no longer award grants to organizations affiliated with churches such as a cooperative group that includes non-ABC churches; applications must be submitted by an ABC church for work being done directly by that church.



Only one application per church will be considered within a 24-month period.

Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions, rainy day funds, church benevolent funds, regular ongoing church operating expenses (i.e. utilities, insurance), repairs, or for capital improvements or repairs to facilities. Grant awards will be sent to the ABC church that is applying for the grant; checks will not be made payable to an individual or ministry.

About Us

Seacoast Community Lunch served its first guests in May, 2018. We have been averaging 75 guests per week and have served as many as 95. We have the capacity to serve 120 guests. The program is run on an entirely volunteer basis and our volunteers are both from our congregation and the surrounding Seacoast Community. I like to say it is the community serving the community as we would not be able to sustain the program without all of our volunteers and contributions from various groups and businesses in the area.

We have modeled our lunch program after an existing program in Portsmouth called Common Table. The Common Table lunch has been in existence for around 17 years. They have been so successful that they wanted to expand by helping another group or organization do a free lunch on a different day of the week.

We currently have eight restaurants and one personal chef who volunteer their time and talents to assist us with menu planning, cooking and serving the meal.

Financial support from ABCUSA Matthew 25 Grant will help us with the cost of the food to be able to offer these free meals to our guests.
