A generous donor has given a sum of money through American Baptist Churches USA Office of the General Secretary, to be used for programs that address "housing, feeding, education and health with regard to the less fortunate." A panel will select recipients for grants of up to \$5,000. Awards will be granted only to ministries of an American Baptist church in good standing with their Region. This is a change from previous grant cycles. We will no longer award grants to organizations affiliated with churches such as a cooperative group that includes non-ABC churches; applications must be submitted by an ABC church for work being done directly by that church.



Only one application per church will be considered within a 24-month period. Because this change was made following the Fall 2016 cycle, recipients of a Spring 2016 grant are eligible to apply.

Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions, rainy day funds, church benevolent funds, regular ongoing church operating expenses (i.e. utilities, insurance), repairs, or for capital improvements to facilities. Grant awards will be sent to the ABC church that is applying for the grant; checks will not be made payable to an individual or ministry.

 Research shows families of low-income and poverty tend to have: 1. a home lacking a text-rich environment, 2. children entering school with an estimated 30,000,000 word gap (as compared to those in a professional family), and 3. a lack of positive parent/child interactions/affirmations which negatively impact the children's education and futures. (Children in poverty get 26,000 affirmations/year; those in working-class get 62,000/year.) Our immediate goal is that parents/caregivers and their child/children will live in an environment that experiences less stress, has more positive affirmations than negative disciplinary comments, encourages healthy habits impacting nutrition and physical wellbeing, and involves them in positive "fun" interactions through stories, singing, and playing together. Through the "Power of Three:

Body, Mind, & Soul" project, these families will be provided assistance with diapers, formula, and baby foods; along with training on nutrition, health and hygiene, and how to have positive interactions within their families more frequently via modeling and practice of read aloud skills, finger plays, quality content conversations, etc. utilizing quality print materials. Our hope is our youngest victims of poverty will have healithier lives, be able to access a better education and social engagement, and eventually, future. because of increased vocabulary and more positive involvement with reading and parent/child interactions experienced as a result of the "Power of Three: Body, Mind, and Soul" program.

We will no longer award grants to organizations affiliated with churches such as a cooperative group that include non-ABC churches; applications must be submitted by an ABC church in good standing.

When determining Grants awards, the following criteria will be considered: whether the church is in good standing within the region; whether the church contributes to United Mission; number of and amounts of previous Matthew 25 Grants received; sustainability of ministry beyond Matthew 25 Grant funding; description of ministry and needs addressed by funding; and the budget submitted along with this application.

Checks will be made payable to the church. Checks will not be made to an individual or ministry.

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Item #3 – Program Description

Objectives:

- 1) Parents/caregivers will receive, read, and respond to parenting tips; use the diapers and wipes for regular cleaning and changes; and provide additional meals for their child/children.
- 2) While participating in the quarterly sessions, parents/caregivers will have opportunities to question and discuss previous weekly parenting tips AND learn additional skills and knowledge to help them provide a safe nurturing environment that cares for the child/children's physical (Body), mental (Mind), and social (Soul) wellbeing.

Registration for "Power of Three: Body, Mind, & Soul" includes completion of an enrollment survey to provide information regarding child's daily routine, including typical meals, meal times, bedtime, and time for reading and play; frequency and types of illnesses and/or visits to a medical facility, an estimate of the number of diapers used daily or weekly; whether they have their own transportation; as well, as diaper sizes and types of formula or baby food requested. (Note: Submitting a completed enrollment survey will serve as the first weekly response ticket for the monthly drawing.) An annual follow-up survey will provide data toward attaining goals.

The Diaper & Baby Food Pantry will be open two-hours one morning per week which corresponds with that day's hours of the MBC Food Pantry. Each week caregivers may obtain diapers and a resource containing parenting tips. Baby wipes will be available, in addition to the diapers, during the third week and baby formula and foods during the fourth week of each month. The amounts of each item will vary based on age and size of child. To encourage the parent/caregivers to read the weekly parenting resource, a drawing from all returned "I read . . ." response slips for each month will be conducted.

Each month, Cornerstone Family Interventions will provide a parenting tips session. Once each quarter, parents/caregivers will participate in a MBC "Power of Three Parenting" session of videos, speakers, modeling and activities that emphasizes the "Power of Three: Body, Mind, and Soul". The "Learn & Do" sessions will be led by volunteer professionals, such as: teachers, nurses, psychologists, and those from various community services. The topics will be those introduced through the resources distributed weekly for that quarter and as identified on the returned "I read ..." responses. The Body session foci will be good nutrition, cleanliness of body and environment, and structuring/organizing a daily routine for meals, baths, naps, bedtimes, etc. based on age-appropriateness. The Mind session foci will include parenting tips for positive interactions between parents/caregivers and child; including ways to handle behavior and stress. The Soul session provides training on how to read with young children, little games to play, and songs to sing to nourish the soul while increasing opportunities for positive interactions and increased affirmations and vocabulary. Participants will receive books for reading aloud, song sheets, nursery rhymes, or games to keep and use at home that they have experienced and practiced during the trainings. The content of most books will reinforce the parenting topics covered each quarter. Though Body, Mind, and Soul are individually and briefly addressed here, they have a great deal of overlap and that will be emphasized, also.

Additionally, "Power of Three Parenting" sessions will include a nutritious easily prepared snack, time for Q & A, and a questionnaire/survey by which parents/caregivers will indicate the implementation of tips, skills, and knowledge and their perceived impact on the child/children and themselves. Anecdotal evidence through the sharing of stories and video will be encouraged, also.
