ABCUSA MATTHEW 25 GRANT APPLICATION - 2017

A generous donor has given a sum of money through American Baptist Churches USA Office of the General Secretary, to be used for programs that address "housing, feeding, education and health with regard to the less fortunate." A panel will select recipients for grants of up to \$5,000. <u>Awards will be granted only to ministries</u> of an American Baptist church in good standing with their Region. This is a change from previous grant cycles. We will no longer award grants to organizations affiliated with churches such as a cooperative group that includes non-ABC churches; applications must be submitted by an ABC church for work being done directly by that church.



Only one application per church will be considered within a 24-month period. Because this change was made following the Fall 2016 cycle, recipients of a Spring 2016 grant are eligible to apply.

Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions, rainy day funds, church benevolent funds, regular ongoing church operating expenses (i.e. utilities, insurance), repairs, or for capital improvements to facilities. Grant awards will be sent to the ABC church that is applying for the grant; checks will not be made payable to an individual or ministry.

With the funds from ABCUSA Matthew 25 grant, we plan to continue to target two specific projects of Adopt-A-Block of Aroostook (AABA): the "Choices" after-school program and "Just 4 Boys" summer camp.

"Choices": AABA responded to a need in the community when we learned that the local schools would be releasing their students an hour earlier every Tuesday to allow for Professional Learning Groups for teachers. This early release presented a hardship for many families in our community. Our community's families struggle with transportation and childcare, anyway, and this additional complication presented a problem. We saw and met that need by partnering with the local schools to bus students grades 1-8 to our church for an afterschool program. In 2017-18 we will be hosting our regular program every Tuesday along with an additional seven times of extended programming. On those seven days students will arrive at noon and stay until 5:00 pm. Because of the positive results from Choices and the great

relationship with the school district we are thrilled to be given an option for extended programming.

From the start of the first year, the word is out that "Choices" provides reliable after-school programming for children. The children have been pouring off the school buses and the MSBC van since September. [We now regularly serve between 55 and 70 children each week..] Because of the rapport built over time and with regular contact with low-income families on our blocks, trust has been built to provide safe, structured, and nurturing educational activities for those children. It is wonderful to see children who continue to return each year and children not on our blocks coming too. Children are inviting their classmates, and continue to respond well to the varied character development activities, the individualized attention, and the safe haven. Terrific Tuesday Kids Choir, is a choice for students, provides children an opportunity to learn a musical drama presenting the gospel for parents and the community two times each school year at Christmas and Mother's Day.

Since we are serving the numbers of students for 34 weeks out of the year, the funds requested will be used for curriculum, educational materials and supplies, healthy snacks, and staffing. We will use these funds to provide activities that build character, promote trust, and build and model healthy relationships with volunteers and staff. In order to break generational cycles of poverty the church must actively provide everything that Matthew 25 encompasses. Our program focuses on just that. If we can reach children at an early age, we are hopeful that the cycles of poverty can be broken in their lifetime.

"Just 4 Boys": We are requesting funds for the seventh annual summer camp program for atrisk boys aged 7-12 called "Just 4 Boys." We invite trusted and respected men and women of all ages in our community who love the Lord, love to have fun, and have a heart to build into the lives of the next generation. These volunteers are able to build relationships with the boys as they pour into them, showing them the love of Christ, and modeling what healthy relationships look like.

The specific intention of our program is to provide fun and challenging activities for boys, opportunities for the presentation of the gospel, spiritual growth and development, community service projects, and Christ-centered achievement opportunities. Funding will help us to continue to provide activities such as art projects, carpentry, field trips, cooking, fishing, swimming, music and science. We will continue to offer three weeks of "Just 4 Boys" day camp five days a week and hope to continue to see boys return every year as we build relationships with them. Funds from this grant will enable us to continue to pick up and drop off campers who would not have a way to camp. By doing this we will be able to reach more campers. Provision of additional food, supplies, transportation and staffing will also be needed.

By providing a continuum of care throughout the year many of the campers started out by attending the Choices after School Program, which shows us that healthy relationships are being built, lives are being changed and that the church is committed to breaking the cycle of poverty in our community.

4. How will the funds assist individuals battling poverty and its effects? What impact do you hope to make on the target group or community? These funds will assist those in poverty by offering them an opportunity for a camp that they would never otherwise have the ability to attend. As we model postive and godly behavior and traits we believe the boys will be influenced to do likewise. Because this program is free, boys attending are offered a chance to see what is possible for their lives and their futures. Giving them options, and pointing them to the one who changes it all, Jesus they are finding hope. One success story is of a young man named Zachary. Zac was a camper the first year of Boys Camp. He came for 4 years and then became a Jr. Mentor for one year, and a strong and committed leader the past two years. Zac is now 17 and has accepted Christ as his savior, attends youth group and this year, was willing to lead bible studies on two different occasions

at camp called "talk time". Zac has come from a difficult family situation, has suffered from bullying as a young child and now is helping other boys overcome these types of struggles. He told us this year, he thanks God for Boys Camp, it has been a lifeline that has led him to Christ and feels like home to him. (Please see his attached letter)

With continued financial support from the ABCUSA Matthew 25 grant, we anticipate that the Adopt-A-Block of Aroostook ministries will continue to be strengthened and deepened. We also anticipate that this corner of the Crown of Maine will begin to shine for the Kingdom as we "love our neighbors as ourselves". Thank you for prayerfully considering our requests.
