

## ABCUSA MATTHEW 25 GRANT APPLICATION

A generous donor has given a sum of money through American Baptist Churches USA to be used for programs that address "housing, feeding, education and health with regard to the less fortunate." A panel will select recipients for grants of up to \$5,000 largely based on the degree to which the funds will be used to directly assist persons in poverty. Ministries must be in relationship with American Baptist Churches USA to be eligible to apply, and only one application per church or ministry will be considered per year. Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions.

## MISSION STATEMENT

Philip's Home is a faith based community that ministers God's transformational love and healing to women who have experienced abuse and brokenness and are at risk of exploitation.

In May of 2011, Philip's Home opened their doors to provide shelter to five at-risk women who are recovering from the trauma of human trafficking or exploitation. The Philip's Home began as an auxiliary mission of Be Free Ministries but was turned over to new directors in 2012. One year later Philip's Home became incorporated and applied for 501 (c) (3) status that was recently approved. Philip's Home is recognized and endorsed by the American Baptist Church of the Dakotas. The co-directors of the program, the Reverends Dennis and Glennys Klumper are both ordained American Baptist pastors who receive no salary from Philip's Home at this time. However, they are supported in part by a monthly stipend from the American Baptist Church of the U.S.A.

Philip's Home provides shelter, resource assistance, life-skills education and a supportive environment to help the residents achieve self-sufficiency and self-worth. These objectives are supported within a caring communal living environment where the women are helped to:

- ⑩ Develop entry level employment skills;
- ⑩ Receive adequate medical and dental help;
- ⑩ Secure therapy for emotional and psychological disorders;
- ⑩ Overcome any addiction issues that may be present; and
- ⑩ Learn about and practice healthy relationship.

Women come to Philip's Home after experiencing horrific abuse and exploitation, often going as far back as childhood. Women who become residents of Philip's Home are expected to pay \$300 per month for rent, including meals. However, the effects of Post-Traumatic Stress Syndrome often hamper some women from securing employment for several months. It takes resiliency and courage to enter a normal work environment after years of exploitation. Fear and distrust are very real and debilitating emotions for the women. Very few of the women are able to pay anything toward their rent initially. A grant from ABCUSA Matthew 25 would help to defray the cost of rent for those women who are too traumatized to seek work right away.

Each women has a private room that is comfortably furnished to meet individual needs. Bathrooms are shared. Both staff and the women share cleaning and cooking responsibilities. The communal living space is available as it would be in any home.

Philip's Home provides a strict drug and alcohol free environment. Individual religious beliefs are respected, however all are welcome to attend a bible study each Wednesday night and off site church services on Sunday mornings. Weekly house meetings are held to discuss issues related to communal living and provide an opportunity for input on matters relating to Philip's Home and its operation. Because safety is of the utmost concern, there is a staff person present in the home at all times.

A grant from ABCUSA Matthew 25 will help Philip's Home to move women away from lives of dependency and degradation. Women will no longer feel disenfranchised from families and communities but will be empowered to regain the dignity and respect that leads to healthy relationships, productive citizenship and self-sufficiency.
