This is a change from previous grant cycles. We will no longer award grants to organizations affiliated with churches such as a cooperative group that includes non-ABC churches; applications must be submitted by an ABC church for work being done directly by that church.



Only one application per church will be considered within a 24-month period.

Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions, rainy day funds, church benevolent funds, regular ongoing church operating expenses (i.e. utilities, insurance), repairs, or for capital improvements or repairs to facilities. Grant awards will be sent to the ABC church that is applying for the grant; checks will not be made payable to an individual or ministry.

Daily Threads is a children and youth clothing closet ministry of West Baptist Chrch in Oswego, NY. Daily Threads will celebrate its grand opening on Sept. 23rd, 2018 with a shoe and sock giveaway for elementary school children (made possibile through member contributions of 75 pairs of shoes and socks). The Matthew 25 funds will enable us to replenish and add to our current inventory. While Daily Threads offers pre-owned clothing, the store supplies new shoes, socks and underwear for hygenic reasons.

4. How will the funds assist individuals battling poverty and its effects? What impact do you hope to make on the target group or community?

A church member proposed the idea of a children and youth clothing closet last winter. While serving as a substitute teacher at the local high school, she noticed that many students wore the same clothes to school each day for a week and that they had no socks to warm their feet during the very cold Central NY winter months. The church member consulted the high school principal, school nurse, and other teachers to confirm the need within the community. These staff members agreed to offer referals of students in need of this type of assistance.

We will no longer award grants to organizations affiliated with churches such as a cooperative group that include non-ABC churches; applications must be submitted by an ABC church in good standing.

When determining Grants awards, the following criteria will be considered: whether the church is in good standing within the region; whether the church contributes to United Mission; number of and amounts of previous Matthew 25 Grants received; sustainability of ministry beyond Matthew 25 Grant funding; description of ministry and needs addressed by funding; and the budget submitted along with this application.

Checks will be made payable to the church. Checks will not be made to an individual or ministry.

Mission Statement:

Daily Threads offers free clothing, shoes, socks, underwear and other basic needs to children and youth in Oswego County. It is lovingly housed within the West Baptist Church in Oswego, NY. The mission of Daily Threads is to fulfill, in small part, Jesus' commission to the faithful in Matthew 25:35–36: "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me" (vs. 35–36). Through loving our neighbors, we come to know God more fully, to follow Jesus more closely, and to embrace the Holy Spirit more intentionally.

The Birth of Daily Threads

The name "Daily Threads" is a word-play on the necessity of "Daily Bread" as stated in the Lord's Prayer.

Following the initial suggestion that the church begin a clothing closet ministry (see grant application for more details) and church council approval, the small, but dedicated congregation of West Baptist Church has made contributions of new socks, underwear, and diapers, in addition to gently used clothing to prepare for the opening of Daily Threads. Church members (including the youth group) have contributed numerous volunteer hours clearing and cleaning the designated space, as well as arranging, sorting, and laundering to bring this vision to fruition.

We will celebrate the opening of daily Threads with a back-to-school new shoe giveaway on Sunday, September 23rd, when we will be giving away over 75 pairs of children's shoes (made possible through a generous individual donation of \$750). Church members will wash the children's feet (according to the model of Jesus in John 13:1–20) and give them new socks and shoes for the school year. Copies of the Gospel of John will be offered to those who wish to take them along with the schedule for Daily Threads.

Daily Threads will be open one day per week and one Saturday a month. The church will also open the closet on request from the school personnel as needs are identified. Each family will receive a loaf of bread (daily bread from their trip to Daily Threads).

The Matthew 25 grant will be very useful in meeting the cost of new underwear, socks, and other clothing needs, allowing the church members to expand the ministry as the needs of the community are identified. While West Baptist has not recently made a contribution to the United Mission fund, we do make contributions each year to America For Christ, World Mission Offering, Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering, One Great Hour of Sharing, and the Regional Offering.
