## Matthew 25 Grant Budget

- 1. The bucket garden and nutrition program.
  - a. The bucket garden:

Provide a 2-1/2 gallon bucket filled 2/3rds with a compost/soil mixture to plan vegetables. The vegetables are to be: a tomato plant start with the options of adding green pepper, green/yellow string bean seeds. With this bucket, a crock-pot will also be provided.

The purpose of this is to provide the means for a person to grow fresh vegetables, in a residence not their own and without access to ground area to plant their own garden. The bucket will become their garden. In the spring they will be provided with the bucket, soil mix, tomato plant start and seeds for green peppers and string beans. By mid-summer, harvesting will take place. The crock-pot will be provided along with several recipes for nutritional meals that the fresh produce and other ingredients obtained through a food pantry can be used to produce a one-pot meal.

Instructions will be provided on how to plant the vegetables, when to water and fertilize. A presentation on the use of the crock-pot will be provided along with a review on how each of the meals can be made.

## Material provided:

2-1/2 gallon plastic container.

Soil mix.

Fertilizer.

Tomato plant start.

Seed(s).

4 stakes and string.

Instructions on planting and maintaining vegetable plants.

#### Nutrition program:

Both menus/recipes and a crock-pot will be provided so that participants may be able to make nutritional meals. Fresh produce from their bucket garden and from the local food pantry will be used to produce a one-pot balanced meal.

## Costs for 75 participants: Following is a breakdown of cost per participant.

2 gallon buckets \$6.00 each.

Soil mix \$2.00

Fertilizer/seeds \$8.00

4 stakes and string \$3.00

Starter trays/Jiffy tray \$1.29

Printing of menus/recipes/instructions \$3.00

Total cost:  $$23.29 \times 75 = $1.746.75$ 

Crock-pots: \$20.00 per participant x 75 = \$1,500.00

Total Project Cost: \$3,246.75
