We will no longer award grants to organizations affiliated with churches such as a cooperative group that includes non-ABC churches; applications must be submitted by an ABC church for work being done directly by that church.



Only one application per church will be considered within a 24-month period. Because this change was made following the Fall 2016 cycle, recipients of a Spring 2016 grant are eligible to apply.

Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions, rainy day funds, church benevolent funds, regular ongoing church operating expenses (i.e. utilities, insurance), repairs, or for capital improvements to facilities. Grant awards will be sent to the ABC church that is applying for the grant; checks will not be made payable to an individual or ministry.

Westview Baptist Church was established in 1915 at the corner of Belmont St. and Morris St. in the south central downtown of Indianapolis. The Church has proclaimed Jesus Christ and has helped the needy and impoverished people in our area for over 100 years. We denominationally belong to the American Baptist Churches of Greater Indianapolis and the American Baptist Churches USA.

Over the last several years we have developed new ministries in our neighborhood in spite of a meager budget if about 60K and an average attendance of about 55 people presently. Many of our involved families are on disability, Medicaid, or retirement incomes and cannot help with the financial part of our Ministries. Most of our Ministries have to be funded by private donations:

We have a Bread Ministry in which we give away each Wednesday night approximately 500 or more loaves of bread and several hundred pastries. We collect these items from local grocery warehouses each week making several trips during the week to collect enough to supplies for the needs.

We have a Food Pantry Ministry where we supply bags of food on Sunday mornings to persons in need. This ministry is supported by the members of our Church.

On Wednesday nights we have a free community dinner. It is prepared and paid for by approximately four family members of our Church. Our attendance averages approximately 95 people a week with approximately 65% of those eating coming from the community with no Church ties.

We also have a Clothing Ministry where people can receive needed clothing items for free. Again, these items are all donated by our Church members and other friends and people in the community.

The largest Ministry is providing a place to worship on Wednesday evening, Sunday morning and occasionally on Sunday nights. Over the last twenty years I have pastored here the continuance of the Church has changed greatly. In the 50's and 60's many of our members moved to the suburbs and now deceased. Over the last few years the majority of our new people have neighborhood ties. It has become a missional Church in the inner city. We can use effectively any help we can received for the sake of our community.
