The requested fund will be used to tutor students for the Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System (MCAS) and Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT) for the refugees and immigrants in middle and high school. In my past years mentoring in TeensAlive ministry, I identified that many students are unable to receive high school diplomas due to their poor performance in the MCAS. A few people who are able to get diploma, due to their poor SAT score they don't get college admission. The target group is refugees and first and second-generation immigrants who attend Lowell Public Schools in Massachusetts. There are 30 prospective students who will need MCAS support and 20 high school students for SAT program. 99 percent of those students come from low-income families that resettled in Lowell. There will be a total of 12 MCAS sessions; (beginning from Spring) 10 SAT classes beginning from late Fall (Oct.)
