2. Mission Statement.

"My house will be called a house of prayer for all nations" (Mark 11:17)

Lowell International Church (LIC) was started on May 29, 2011 as a house of worship for refugees from all nationalities in Lowell. However most of the church members are from various ethnic groups from Burma. Since early 2000's there has been influx of refugees from Burma in Lowell. Incidentally, many these refugees were Baptist Christians. These different ethnic groups from Burma speak different languages and possess different cultures and worldviews. Therefore, LIC was started as a multi-ethnic, multi-national church to reflect the microcosm of the Kingdom of God where there will be people from different nationalities. LIC uses the Burmese language for preaching and worship and all are welcome. The church membership is comprised of several ethnic groups including: Pwo Karen, Sgaw Karen, Shan, Kachin, Chin, Karenni and Bwe. The

average Sunday attendance is around 40. We have approximately 30 children from LIC that attend the Calvary Baptist Church Sunday School.

LIC Pastoral Support for Refugee Ministry:

For the last 5 years, LIC has not had a consistent pastor who lives in Lowell. For many years, Rev. Dr. Maung Maung Htwe, currently the pastor of Overseas Burmese Christian Fellowship (OBCF) in 30 Gordon St. Allston, MA 02134, have overseen the church. However, LIC is now fortunate to have Rev. Ko Ko Lay, theologically trained and an ordained minister from Burma that start working in the Church. Since, his arrival the church has been challenged to stretch the vision of becoming self-sustaining. The church attendance has increased over this period. For the first time, Rev. Ko Ko Lay has developed a church budget and has been encouraging church members to give and tithe to the church. The church members start giving in-kind donations to Rev. Lay's family, such as groceries, toiletries and clothing for his family, comprised of himself, a wife, and three children. Additionally, LIC is also providing rent for their pastor in the amount of \$1000 every month.

However, the church does not have any additional financial support from the memberships to do the very important mission work because most the members are refugees and do not have consistent income or a stable job. Yet, LIC needs someone like Rev. Lay to make the Church grow, both fiscally and spiritually.

These are some reasons why Lowell International Church is growing:

- Rev. Ko Ko Lay is accepted by all the Burmese ethnic groups, including the Muslim and Buddhist families, as their leader.
- In addition to pastoral work, Rev. Lay is very active in providing general refugee support. He helps the refugees with basic tasks such as: translating their mail, helping them with follow-up phone calls as a translator, and providing transporting and translation services for visits to various locations including doctor appointments, and other locations related to Social Security, Transitional Assistance, Food Stamps, and Health Insurance, pick up the children who attend the Sunday School and church.
- The greater Lowell Burmese Refugee Community, consisting of approximately 65 families.
- At least 130 people will receive direct help from Rev. Ko Ko Lay's work with the refugee community.
