West Virginia Baptist Convention Parchment Valley Conference Center 2016 Brother's Keeper Program Explanation

WHAT IS BROTHER'S KEEPER?

Established in 2000, Brothers' Keeper at the West Virginia Baptist Convention at Parchment Valley Conference Center reaches out every year to the Jackson County, West Virginia, community for mission projects. Jackson County is located in west central West Virginia and borders the Ohio River. Most of the work involves construction projects for low-income families or families with a handicapped member.

Youth groups from throughout West Virginia and surrounding states congregate at Parchment Valley Conference Center, which is designated as the hub of the Brothers' Keeper activities. The young people, skilled laymen, and pastoral leaders are housed here at the conference center. They work on assigned projects in the daytime and have evenings filled with Spiritual activities.

In 2015 we housed approximately 180 youths, who each day ventured into the mission field to not only labor, but to minister to individuals, to learn skills, to spend a hard, long day working, but most of all, to learn the joy of giving of oneself. Each work crew is assigned an adult, skilled crew leader for guidance, supervision and training. Many of the crew leaders are ordained pastors who do double duty in teaching both work skills and Spiritual skills to the youth participants.

In 2015 Brothers' Keeper served fifty-four families In Jackson County, all while developing a mind for mission work in over 200 youth missionaries. At the center of yearly planning for 2016 is Gospel Scripture from Matthew 25:40. What better way to serve Christ than by serving his creation?

If grant funding is allotted to this project, the funding will be spent on additional tools and equipment and building supplies. A few of the individuals who are recipients of the work contribute what they can to the cost of the building supplies; however, most are financially unable to contribute anything at all.
