The Dominican Republic Team has been serving the poor since 1990. We have grown in size and in ministry over the past 24 years. We have been building a much needed hospital, setting up water filters in homes, rebuilding homes (shacks), building churches, evangelizing, providing instruction and recreation and in 2010 began delivering food door to door in the poor sugar cane villages or bateyes (FulFilling Smiles). We are now moving into our next phase of FulFilling Smiles, and are setting up sustainable programs. This past Fall we began constructing container gardens on Batey 50 and the Joe Hartman School, which when we visited in January were flourishing with lettuce, tomato plants, and squash plants.

We would like to expand this phase to include building container gardens near a water source (many bateys have a small stream, pond or well), building a pump to get the water to the gardens and enclosing the gardens to protect them from animals or intruders.

An additional focus of this year's project will be to teach the locals to make their own charcoal. Most homes have no means for starting a fire and there is no electricity in these remote bateyes. We are blessed with a college student studying engineering who wants to collaborate with FulFilling Smiles and dedicate part of his summer to working on this project. We cannot move forward and capture this opportunity without the funds.
