ABCUSA Matthew 25 Grant Application Second Round From the First Baptist Church of Trenton, NJ

The following will describes how the funds will assist our individuals who are battling poverty.

The First Baptist Church of Trenton continues to provide needed services for poor, inner-city refugees from Burma. We are also concerned with literacy. This funding will support our part time volunteer lay leaders in Trenton as they help our needy by translating language when needed. They help our refugees when they need translation for employment, health facilities or health issues, school, filling out applications of any sort such as job applications, food stamp applications, medical, dental, police and legal services, housing opportunities, parent teacher conferences, driver license tests, income tax preparation, and other social services. They help families learn where free resources are available for food, clothing, furniture, etc. And, they help transport people to work and, most importantly, to church. This funding will also support ESL curricula and stipends for tutors. Other (unpaid) volunteers provide the ESL instruction for youth which have been sustained for four years.

They also provide transportation for our refugees from Burma to these different sites. In addition the funding will help as we continue to teach (ESL) English as a Second Language to help empower our refugees as they seek to one day become whole and healthy citizens of the United States. We also provide tutoring for youth.

It was an exciting year for FBC Trenton! Some of our youth graduated from high school. Tutoring was a great part of their success. This is a major accomplishment in Trenton where the high school graduation rate is low. Furthermore, this is a great accomplishment because more of our refugees are seeking to go to college. This being the case, we are tutoring and preparing them for the SAT; Presently, one of our refugees through tutoring and mentoring has done well in high school where she has now been accepted to Eastern University. It's truly a blessing.

We continue to provide ESL, tutoring, Bible study and choir practice for our youth each Saturday during the school year. Volunteers serve each Saturday. The paid tutors meet with the students at other times during the week. Other funds supported retreats and ice skating and visits to the park for our youth. During spring break 65 youth attended a retreat held at the church. Last August *Central: Christ Centered Church of Ewing* helped us with an evening Kid's Camp where 86 attended. With *Central's* generosity we were able to provide backpacks filed with school supplies for each child. Six of our children received monies so they could spend a week at the Baptist Camp in Lebanon. The youth help with clean-up projects in the neighborhood and sing at various churches and also in the local nursing home.

We serve dinner three nights a week at our soup kitchen. (In 2014 we served 11,350 meals.) The food pantry is available. The Praise Dance continues to minister. Free tax preparation is available for those earning less than \$58,000. Twice monthly we offer a "poetry group" where youth can write and learn about presentation, and build confidence as well as improve grammar. This winter we began "Chess for Kids." Once again we took our youth to the Delaware Water Gap and they climbed a mountain to enjoy the fellowship and the foliage. The attached *Annual Report* includes additional information.

We appreciate your continuing support as we welcome the stranger and minister in Christ's name.

2014 Annual Report from the Rev. C Nadir Powell, Pastor Interim

"Tend my sheep." John 21:16b

We are a diverse congregation with people from Uganda, Liberia, Nigeria, Jamaica, Haiti, Korea, Malaysia, Thailand, Burma/Myanmar and America! We serve dinner in our soup kitchen three evenings a week. Between 800 and 1000 meals were served each month during 2014 for a yearly total around 11,350. The food pantry serves at other times during the week. Free tax preparation is available for those earning less than \$50,000. We also served as a polling place.

In 2014 four (4) members joined: Emily and Tyler Davis; Saw Htu and Mikhine Htu on 12/28. We grieved the loss of long time member Clarence Landsparger, Helen Spiegal, and Par Reh. I along with Pastor Liz officiated Clarence's home going. I officiated Helen's home going. I also officiated member Philip Wilson's sister Victoria Wilson Cooper's memorial service. Member Linda Wea lost her beloved husband this year. We dedicated baby Brinton Marije Nwokomah on 6/15. Our congregation is blessed with fifty five (55) members. We have 53 Burma Karen families, (20) adults and (33) children from our Burma Karen and Karenni families. There's been a decline in membership because we have witness more than ten families moved out of state since 2013.

English as a Second Language (ESL) continued on Saturdays through January ending in May 2014 for summer break. The program restarted in the fall from October to December 2014. On a whole we averaged between 10-12 youth that participated in our (ESL) classes. We provided individual tutoring for students. Nick Travers and volunteers from the Bonner center from TCNJ teach ESL. Emily Davis supervises it. We are also helping two girls with SAT preparation so they will be prepared for college after high school.

Outreach continues at FBCT. We continued our poetry ministry to help empower youth in our community. We use poetry as a means to help give them confidence in themselves, but also to help them in their speech. Once their skills improved we gave a poetry/talent showcase on May 10 so they could share what they had learned. We partnered with Verses of the Soul and the Boys & Girl Club to put on this event. Our youth from FBCT participated and shared their talents as well. Our Karen dancers shared their cultural dance. Many came out to support this event. We had a sign/banner made to promote the church. In addition, we had promotion cards made to promote FBCT. We gave a church/community picnic/cookout on church grounds. We were blessed to have a few people from the community to come out. Our youth teamed up with CareTrenton to help cleanup Columbus Park in September.

Under the leadership of Rev Kang, sixty (60) youth attended a retreat held at church during Spring break. Rev Kang took (9) youth fall hiking. This past summer six (6) of our youth enjoyed a week at the Lebanon Baptist Camp in Lebanon, New Jersey. I coordinated a field trip for our youth with Leotyne Anglin of Beyond Expectations to go to Riverview Studios in Bordentown. Together Rev Kang and I took fourteen (14) youth to Riverview Studios to learn about Speed crewing. They learned how to use studio cameras. In addition they wrote and produced their own shows to be recorded at the studio. They had a great time and they learned so much about studio work. We also partnered with Next Generation church November 22nd. Our youth joined them to pack food bags to give to the needy for Thanksgiving. They also provided praise music and song at the fellowship,

I met with Pastor Gilmore of *Central Christ Centered Church of Ewing* in order to partner for our VBS camp. I appointed Minister Emily Davis to be lead person. She attended meetings at Central to see how they ran their camp. We both managed the church during the nights of VBS camp. We were blessed to have 86 youth attending VBS in August. All the youth received backpacks and school supplies. We also partnered with Catholic Charities and gave away back packs and school supplies to refugees and those who were impoverished.

Thanks to Kharmia Powell and the Board of Christian Education, we have been able to provide *Chess for Kids*, ages 5 - 12. The class has been taught by Alexandra Jain and her son Nicholas. Mrs. Jain teaches beginning chess to young children at the Princeton Day School. Her son Nicholas and Bryce Powell assist in the classes. Both of these boys are rated US Chess Federation players and have participated in chess tournaments. This new chess club has been very popular and will continue to meet in 2015.

Kharmia Powell also leads our second hour that takes place during worship service. Second hour is a ministry that seeks to teach our youth about the bible. She shows them how to apply the word of God to their daily lives. Through her teachings, she is helping them to develop into disciples for the kingdom of God. She also uses our church handbook to teach them what it means to be a Baptist. They've had their own children church service where each of them had the opportunity to bring forth the word of God in their own way. We thank Kharmia Powell for serving as an instrument of God who seeks to empower and equip our youth for ministry.

We rejoice in having the 'Angels of God" Praise Dance group minister to us at "Hanging of the Greens." We thank Mrs. Kharmia Powell for making this happen. We had our annual Christmas dinner. In addition the Pluckermin Handbell choir blessed us with Christmas songs. We collected toys at our pre-Christmas dinner. We donated them to Crisis Ministry for the under privileged. We also hosted a Karen/ Karenni Christmas celebration on Christmas Day. It was truly a blessing. They touched my heart by providing me with gifts. At their celebration, I was able to give gifts to all of our youth provided by our donors Carl Stoltenberg and the Stoltenberg family.

It has been a year of transition because our Senior Pastor Elizabeth Congdon suffered severe injuries from a bad fall. In response to this unfortunate accident, the official board met and asks me if I could fulfill the ½ time that Pastor Liz served. I agreed and they made me pastor interim. From March to the present, I've been serving ¾ time and it's truly been a blessing to lead such a loving people. Ministry is still going forward and we haven't missed a beat. We also give God the praise because Pastor Liz is now healed. However, after much prayer she decided to retire from the pastorate in August. She preached her retirement sermon in September and we gave her a retirement celebration in which she was overjoyed. All in all, the 2014 year still went well. We added Minister Emily Davis to our staff. She's done an excellent job. I had the pleasure of licensing her April 13. Emily assists in Sunday worship, teaches children Sunday school, preaches quarterly, work with our youth, and coordinates ESL.

Our Karen/Karenni continues to meet for service Sunday mornings. Time to time, they've had visitors that preached at their services time to time. They had a special service where Rev Lasing from Philadelphia Burmese Baptist Church preached. Reverend Lasing also fellowshipped with us at our general service on December 7th. Our Karen youth continues to bless us with music at our general service.

Most of the year, Rev. Kang met with our Karen/Karenni youth on Saturday afternoons. Furthermore, he led our prison ministry. Unfortunately, due to a family situation, he had to move out of state to help family. He is truly missed. I now head our prison ministry where I preach at Trenton State Prison once a month. I, also with the help of Minister Emily provide a worship service at *Hamilton Grove Care Facility* for senior citizens. Last year we continued our fellowship with joining *Sacred Heart* and other churches on Good Friday to participate in the walk of "The Way of the Cross".

My *teaching* included new member's class, mentoring our new minister, Sunday worship service, and counseling. I continue to speak in other churches. I served on an ABC ordination council. I also serve as a mentor for Joyce Kilmer School.

During 2014 I provided pastoral care for sixty (60) persons. This included home, hospital, long term care facilities visits, and care at the church.

Sunday school continues to meet. Teaching is provided by Abigail Amutah, Philip Wilson, Emily Davis, Tyler Davis, and Kamiyah.

Sunday worship continues under my leadership. Emily Davis shares in the service.

Christian Education, Trustees, and the Deacon Board continue to meet monthly. Thanks to grants from the ABCNJ, I was able to help our two seminarians to get 2 separate scholarships a piece for continuing education from American Baptist Home Missions. We also received the Matthew 25 grant from ABCUSA. In addition, I was able to write a proposal for the Anti-Poverty grant which we received at the ABCNJ Annual Session 2014. Abigail Amutah, James Kang, and Philip Wilson were our voted delegates for the session. Capital Association blessed us with a donation. We also continue to receive endorsements from private donors. The donations that we've received helped us to provide help to our Karen and Karenni members.

I continue to serve on the steering committee board of the *United Mercer Interfaith Organization* (UMIO).

I serve on the advisory board at Joyce Kilmer School.

I'm a member of the Trenton Stakeholders.

I continue to work with Capital Association.

God has blessed us to continue our ministries. Again, it's been a year of many transitions, but all in all, the latter turn out better than the rest. Truly we are blessed at the First Baptist Church (FBC) of Trenton!

2014 Annual Report from Emily Davis

'God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good." Genesis 1:31a

God has truly blessed our community. It has been an amazing year of ministry. Many of us provided **leadership** and service, including our many youth who continue to take on more active roles in serving, singing, and leading worship. I provided leadership, preaching, and pastoral care throughout the year, especially during times when Rev. Powell was on vacation. I was **licensed to preach** by FBCT in April. **Pastor Liz's retirement** worship service and luncheon were held in September. Many people came out for a time of celebration and thanks for her five years of ministry at FBCT.

Throughout the spring, **children's Sunday school** was taught by Tyler Davis and me. In October and in Elizabeth Kang's absence, Tyler Davis, Kahmiya Htoo, and I joined together to teach both children's worship and Sunday school. The children were honored and received award certificates in the worship service in December.

There were many **youth fellowship events** and Christian education. In February, many of us went ice skating. Sixty-five people participated in a two-day youth retreat held at our church in June. Rev. Kang continued to teach youth Bible study through the summer. In July, I did Christian education with the female youth on the documentary *Half the Sky: Turning Oppression into Opportunity for Women Worldwide*. Nick Travers organized a youth field trip to go kayaking. Twenty-three of us participated. With Rev.-Kang and Rev. Powell, the youth went to Riverview Studios in Bordentown to learn about the television industry. The youth went hiking with Rev. Kang in October, and we partnered with Next Generation Church to have a joint youth fellowship in November.

English as a second language, or **ESL**, for youth continued each Saturday from January to April and October to December. We had an average attendance of sixteen volunteer teachers and youth each Saturday. We had twenty-four students from the Bonner Foundation at The College of NJ volunteer through the fall. Our Karen/Karenni families prepared the lunches. A special thanks to Martha Hla, Jack Soe, and Mi Khine Htu for the delicious meals. Private tutors, Nick Travers and Brian Daly, continued to do **tutoring** with several of our youth. The youth practiced English and studied for the SAT. In June, we had two students graduate from high school. During the fall, I helped two students with college applications. I led a **women's ministry** that ran through the fall and then was opened up to all adults. This ministry was based around the documentary *Half the Sky* about the oppression and opportunity of women. The final event included twelve people.

Many of us participated in **Karen/Karenni community** events. Many of us attended the Karen New Year celebration that was held at the ABCUSA Mission Center in Valley Forge in January. We continued to stay connected to those Karen/Karenni families who had moved away. Nick Travers and a group of youth attended the wedding of Sai Shwe and Saymo in Syracuse in October. The Karen/Karenni community coordinated regularly in worship and fellowship with Philadelphia Burmese Baptist Church.

We continued our partnership with Central Church in Ewing to put on **Kids Camp**, or **Vacation Bible School**, at our church in August. We worked closely with their camp directors in order to make Kids Camp at FBCT a success. There was an average attendance of eighty children and volunteers each night.

First Things, our **church newsletter**, continued to run each month with regularly contributed articles and announcements. Thanks to Alicia Johnson for developing the newsletter throughout the year.

We celebrated **Christmas** with our Hanging of the Greens event, a Christmas Eve service, and a Karen and Karenni celebration on Christmas morning. Hanging of the Greens included decorating, dinner, dancing from the Karenni youth and the Angels of God, and the Pluckemin Bell Choir. The Karen and Karenni celebration included worship, lunch, presents, and dancing.

We continued our **outreach** ministries. An outreach committee met through the spring, and the church picnic was held in June. We continued to lead worship and preach at the chapel service at Hamilton Grove Healthcare and Rehabilitation Center. Many of us, including the youth, continued to promote the church and the ministries.

Let us give thanks to God for a year of blessings in ministry. Let us continue to worship God as we continue to witness the ways that God has done and is doing good things.

Deacon's Report- 2014

Beloved, let us love one another because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God. For God is love (1 John 7:8). The most amazing thing about the deacons meetings this year is meeting with new prospective members. In 2014 the deacons met with four persons seeking membership in our church. They were Saw Htu, Mikhine Htu, Emily and Tyler. They later joined the church. Mrs. Emily Davis is serving as a minister of the church. On December 28, 2014 Abby made a motion, and second by Tom Johnson. All was in favor to extend their right hand of fellowship to Saw Htu and Mikhine Htu. The deacon's fund is managed by the deacon's board, we try to assist the members of our congregation in the time of their needs we also gave help occasionally to people outside of our immediate church family.

During the Christmas season, the deacons agreed, -to appeal to the congregation to send contributions to the Baptist home in South Jersey, to purchase gifts for those residents who could not afford it, we also send help to disaster victims at home and other parts of the world. This is our twelfth year working along with the Trenton area soup kitchen feeding program of South Trenton, we provide food and other assistance to our neighbors, who have fallen on hard times due to the current economic crisis, the members have also contributed food, clothing and personal items to those in need, in December we received new coats from the state coats drive and from other congregations that have given other needed items to help the growing needs of our community. This year our senior pastor. Ms. Elizabeth B. Congdon retired due to health reason, the members had a luncheon in her honor, and it was well attend by her family and friends. The associate pastor Calvin Nadir Powell is serving as our interim pastor.

For many years, the First Baptist women have always supported the ministry of the White Cross mission. By sending items to mission sites around the country and to other countries. When our food pantry goes low or wiped out, it is replenished by several congregations in the capital association.

First Baptist still provided translation and transportation ministry to refugee families who needs help navigating to school and health programs. This is the fifth years of our ESL ministry, the ministry helps our high school students improve their English and math skills, our two seminary students assist, also, some members of our congregation and members from other congregations and ABC churches. In addition, we are assisted by students from the College of New Jersey and members of the Bonne program. The deacons usually send packages to our youth, attending college to remind them that, they are in our thoughts. At Christmas time and Easter, we the deacons try to visit members of our congregation, who are unable to attend church, due to health and old age. Flowers and cards are sent to them as a reminder that First Baptist Church still cares, and is praying for them. We had two seminary students last year with us. Emily and Tyler Davis, have brought fresh new ideas to our congregation it a privilege and joy to be part of their ministry training experience. Unfortunately, we had three death this year. Par Reh, Clarence Landsparger and Helen Spiegel. Clarence and Helen were long serving dedicated members. They will all be greatly missed. It has been a pleasure to have served this great congregation of First Baptist Church as your deacons, thank you.
