Baptist Talk Conversations, held Sunday afternoon, provide an opportunity for persons to share their thoughts, views, ideas, ministries, and concerns with one another around topics that they care about deeply. This year, the Mission Summit Conversations and Baptist Talk sessions have been combined. A teaching component on Civil Discourse will be provided by the National Institute for Civil Discourse. Following the presentation, participants will have an opportunity to engage in a Mission Summit/Baptist Talk conversation.

Conversation Topics include: Church Mergers, Satellites, and Shared Ministries; Cross Generational Ministry; Discipling Alternatives to Sunday School; Faith and Politics; Overcoming Barriers to Women Serving Local Congregations; Racism; Selling the Building but Maintaining the Congregation; Systemic Solutions to Poverty; and Systemic Solutions to Violence.

Speakers



Dr. Howard Stevenson is the Constance Clayton professor of Urban Education, professor of Africana Studies, in the Human Development & Quantitative Methods Division of the Graduate School of Education at the University of Pennsylvania. He is the executive director of the Racial Empowerment Collaborative at Penn, designed

to promote racial literacy in education, health, community and justice institutions. He is a nationally recognized clinical psychologist and researcher on negotiating racial conflicts using racial literacy for independent and public K-12 schooling, community mental health centers, teachers, police and parents.



Rev. Dr. Elijah Brown, originally from the state of Texas, assumed the position of general secretary of the Baptist World Alliance on January 1, 2018. He had more than a decade long involvement in the international umbrella organization for Baptists before joining its staff, starting in 2005. His specialties lie in human rights and

religious liberty. His doctoral work focused on issues related to World Christianity, including mission and church growth, peace-building and conflict resolution, and the interaction of religion and politics.



Dr. Jolene Erlacher founded Leading Tomorrow in 2013 with the aim of equipping churches, businesses, schools, missions agencies and other organizations for effective inter-generational leadership in an evolving culture. Her passion for equipping a new generation of leaders emerged from various leadership experiences in education

and ministry. She has focused on researching the experiences and needs of Millennials in ministry positions. Her book, *Millennials in Ministry* (Judson Press) documents her findings. She specializes in providing training and consulting on team effectiveness and inter-generational leadership.



Rev. Ngwedla Paul Msiza is a native of South Africa. He was installed on July 25, 2015, as the second African to be president of the Baptist World Alliance (BWA). Prior to serving as president, in 2010 he was elected one of the 12 vice presidents of the BWA. Msiza was president of the All Africa Baptist Fellowship, one of six regional fellowships of

the BWA, from 2006 to 2011 and general secretary of the Baptist Convention of South Africa (BCSA) from 2001 to 2010. He is the senior pastor of Peniel Salem Baptist Church in Pretoria.
