Greetings from the American Baptist Indian Caucus.

Our Native American Churches greet you as well from the east to the west of our United States. We have a rich, diverse heritage of tribal people that our Regional Representatives work within. The thirty churches we represent make up many tribes all different in their languages and cultures. It is with joy that we confer from time to time with each other as well as in our regions during shared associational gatherings.

Our ABIC met in July, 2018 at the Tuscarora Indian Mission on the Tuscarora Indian Reservation near Niagara, New York. They were gracious hosts and we were greeted warmly and received with joy as much as family. Our shared stories were enjoyed by all. Great meals and fellowship was also a treat throughout our time together. Our theme was from I Corinthians 13:13, Faith, Hope & Love. We incorporated our own speakers who shared their ministry and gifts. We were delighted with the results as our speakers were genuine and unique in approach and appeal. Through our group discussions we explored concerns, issues and needs.

One of our top needs is for developing and cultivating new leaders and pastors in the churches. Our Coordinator, Rev Ben Sullivan and the Intercultural Ministries team of ABHMS have begun to formulate trainings to reach our communities and families in our regions. Several of our Caucus representatives attended a Leadership consultation on November 3rd with Rev. Salvador Orellana of ABHMS and consultant Hector Cortez in Norman, OK. We had a day of working through our top needs within the churches and developed a set of course topics that will be used to train the next generation of leaders. This is a dream realized as we have as a caucus been working toward this goal for several years.

We continue to utilized conference calls to plan and pray for our churches and the ways we would accomplish our shared goals. Again the use of these calls have been useful in keeping our costs minimal. This has been a great way for us to meet and has provided a vehicle for keeping in touch.
