Associated Ministry Organizations (AMO's) are organizations that have been granted AMO status by the Board of General Ministries. This status allows the organization to use the name "American Baptist," claim American Baptist status and use the American Baptist logo.

AMO's must be a national or sectional American Baptist or other religious organization that indicates its willingness: to support the statement of purpose in the Bylaws of ABCUSA, to cooperate whole-heartedly in such relationships and projects at all levels of denominational life which seem advisable, and to be identified as an organization related to and participating in the life of ABCUSA by use of name and/or logo." Though autonomous organizations, AMO's share in the ministry of God under the name of ABCUSA, strengthening and extending our reach into the world.

# ABMEN USA PRESIDENT MINISTRY REPORT

## Greetings

- It is a great time to be an American Baptist Man and I bring you greetings from MEN all over the country.
- I am so encouraged to share just a few highlights of our National ministry and the work of so many men.

## A Brief History

- Following the 1<sup>st</sup> world war, in 1918, the Northern Baptist Convention contacted an *ad hoc* group of men and asked them to raise 1,000,000.00 dollars for its Mission Budget. Successful in their efforts, less than a year later they were asked to raise 6,000,000.00 dollars more representing the entire Missionary Budget for 1919. Again they were successful.
- This *ad hoc* group of men believed there was a stirring in men following the war. That the men were looking for a way out of the pews and into the mission fields. And in 1922 they ultimately organized what we today, some 99 years later, known as American Baptist Men USA.
- ABMen USA in cooperation with other members of the American Baptist USA family, seek to encourage men to develop a vital relationship with Jesus Christ and to fulfill their mission to men.

## Purpose of ABM USA

- **To strengthen the spiritual life of men through shared fellowship, caring, study and prayer.**
- And we try to encourage this through efforts including;  
Assisting with the creation and training of service programs and projects that

utilize men's spiritual gifts in ministry.

Encouraging men to yoke with their Pastors in shared ministry

Help develop and train basic skills that men can use in their ministries.

To encourage and strengthen the roles and identities of a Christian man in today's world.

## Ministry Mission Review

Last year was a very challenging year. The onset of the COVID-19 pandemic caused us to postpone our scheduled mission projects; we well as in-person meetings and conferences. However, ABMen throughout the nation remained steadfast in their commitment to mission and ministry of ABMen by conducting virtual conferences, prayer breakfasts, Bible studies, etc. In addition, ABMen focused on local and regional projects that fell within the pandemic travel and other restrictions.

Despite the challenges presented by the pandemic, ABMen were able to provide a limited disaster relief response to the flooding in Lake Charles, Louisiana; as well as assist a homeless community in Wheeling, West Virginia through the use of our shower and laundry trailer.

Finally, 2020 culminated in a virtual ABMen National Conference held in December.

### **What Lies Ahead**

In 2021 we have once again scheduled those work projects that were postponed in 2020. These include a fall work project at the Green Lake Conference Center; as well as an extensive rebuilding project at Crow Community Baptist Church in Crow Agency, Montana.

All across the Ranch, there is renewed hope that the COVID 19 pandemic is behind us! We look forward to a brighter future in the Promises of God.

Heroic employees in action and prayer implemented every possible precaution to “stop the virus at the gate!” Despite our best efforts and CDC precautions, Rainbow Acres had nine cases of COVID among the Ranchers. However, the symptoms were mild! No one was hospitalized.

We were blessed with the highest levels of cooperation from Rancher Families. We Celebrated Christmas in the midst of the pandemic with Chaplain Mitch Koonce reading the Christmas Story over our Rainbow radio station KOTR; mountains of gifts under the Christmas Tree on Christmas Morning and a traditional Christmas Dinner for over 80 Ranchers and their Caregivers.

The Rainbow Acres Academy Team maintained quality educational and enrichment activities as the precautions increased and Ranchers remained confined to their homes. The Academy Team modified their teaching approaches four or five times to help everyone through that stressful time.

The Ranchers’ attitudes and acceptance of the precautionary measures were beyond our expectations. When the COVID vaccine became available in Arizona, the Ranchers were patiently waiting for Rainbow’s turn to host a Vaccination Clinic. Over 89 percent of the Ranchers completed the vaccination process. They also have a 99 percent participation with the Seasonal Flu Vaccination.

Rancher life has nearly returned to familiar activities; Academy Classes of 12-15 Ranchers per class session, nearly perfect attendance in 33 different Classes and Arts & Crafts. Ranchers are returning to employment opportunities on Ranch and in Sedona and the Verde Valley where safety practices are in place. Most important of all, they are enjoying being outdoors and walking Hoover Circle with their friends.

Other good news since our last report includes, the completion of the new covered patio at the Worden Taber Center that provides the Ranchers a pleasant fresh air gathering place. Prayer Circle and Sunday Worship are held on this patio. Attendance is the highest since COVID.

The Greenhouses yielded nearly 7,000 pounds of fresh produce for use in the Palmer Center Kitchen, with plenty to share with Senior Centers in Sedona and the Verde Valley. An automated irrigation system has been installed in the outdoor garden to increase production and efficiency of water.

We are in the midst of planning for renovation of Frese House, now 20 years old to improve the comfort for the Ranchers and more efficient utilization of energy.

There is always excitement with the arrival of new Ranchers, several admissions are pending for this summer.
